WHEREAS, a public hearing has been held and concluded this date in order to provide all interested persons the opportunity to present remonstrances and objections to the Council;

# A RESOLUTION APPROVING DEDUCTION FROM ASSESSED VALUE FOR REAL ESTATE IMPROVEMENTS IN AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA (B & C DEVELOPMENT LLC)

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2017-039, adopted September 26, 2017, the Delaware County Council ("Council") designated 12.85 acres in Hamilton Township, Delaware County, Indiana, and located on Indiana State Road 3 North (Parcel No. 18-07-23-300-020.000-006) ("Real Estate"), as an economic revitalization area for purposes of establishing a deduction to the assessed value of real estate; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2017-041, adopted October 24, 2017, after due notice and a public hearing, the Council confirmed the designation of the Real Estate as an economic revitalization area; and

WHEREAS, B & C Development LLC ("Owner") has filed an Application for Tax Abatement and submitted a Statement of Benefits ("Application") for proposed construction of a new 7,200 square foot building at an estimated cost of \$889,741.00 ("Project") on the Real Estate;

### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

- The Council finds and determines that the Application meets the requirements for tax abatement for real estate improvements.
- The Owner is granted a deduction from assessed value for real estate improvements on the Real Estate for five (5) years in accordance with the following schedule:

The Owner shall update the Council with respect to the status of construction, as well as employment, wage and benefit projections set for the in the Application throughout the term of the tax abatement and as requested by the Council.

#### **CASA Memorandum of Understanding**

This Memorandum of Understanding Is entered into by and between Delaware County CASA Advisory Board, Delaware County Council, Delaware County Auditor and the Delaware County Courts, and is executed pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below. In consideration of those mutual undertakings and covenants, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Delaware County CASA is run and governed by the Delaware County Judges.
- Delaware County CASA has an Advisory Board which is not-for-profit and assists Delaware County CASA with fundraising, and is not a governance board over CASA.
- The CASA Advisory Board shall accept donations by way of fundraising events and said donations shall only be used to support the CASA Program, CASA Volunteers, CASA Staff and special needs of the children served by the CASA Program.
   Delaware County CASA has a designated Fund through the County which is for the purpose of
- 4. Delaware County CASA has a designated Fund through the County which is for the purpose of grants or funds received through the not-for-profit status of the Advisory Board or by other organizations/individuals providing funding to the program. Said account shall be referred to as "4102"
- All funds acquired by the Advisory Board for CASA Program operational costs will be allocated into the Delaware County GAL/CASA Donation Fund 4102.
- Said funds in 4102 may be used only by Delaware County CASA and shall not be used by Delaware County Council for any other purpose and shall not revert to County General funds at any time.
- 7. All funds acquired by the Advisory Board are additional funds for the benefit of Delaware County CASA to assist in building the program through the hiring of additional personnel, and are to be deposited into 4102 and are not to be used to pay the county back for any funds the county has already agreed or planned to provide to the program.
- Likewise, any property donated to the Delaware County CASA program shall become the property of Delaware County CASA Program and shall not be the property of the Advisory Board or the County.
- The Delaware County CASA Program shall take the responsibility of satisfying the terms and conditions of any grants received through the Advisory Board upon the allocation of the funds into the GAL/CASA Donation Fund.
- 10. Any fundraising events shall be coordinated through the Executive Director of Delaware County CASA. Any such events organized by the Advisory Board shall be approved by the Executive Director but shall be staffed by the Advisory Board.
