SECOND READING OF ORDINANCES

COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TO ISSUE TAXABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2013 DD DANNAR, LLC, PROJECT ORDINANCE 2013-012

Mr. Brad Bookout, Economic Development Alliance, asked for consideration on the second reading of Ordinance 2013-012, DD Dannar.

MOTION: Councilman Jones motioned to approve Ordinance 2013-012, DD Dannar, Authorizing the County to Issue Taxable Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2013.

SECOND: Councilwoman Chambers

Councilman Alexander said there has been a lot of questions/research done by Council members. Alexander said Dannar has backing of local money and "we" will be able to see in the first 12 months whether this is going to be a good thing. The timeline is to have one unit out by the quarter and 75 units by the end of 2013.

Councilman Quakenbush said he had asked Mr. Dannar previously if these funds were to be approved, would he be seeking any other public funds and he said no. After the meeting, Mr. Keith Roysdon, Muncie Star, said if Mr. Dannar is within certain criteria, Dannar will receive around \$2 million from State of Indiana. Quakenbush said he was curious why he answered "no" when he plans to get a lot more money from the State of Indiana. The approval of this fund will let "him" take a giant step toward the \$2 million. Councilman Quakenbush said he talked with someone from the South Carolina organization that loaned money initially (hearsay) and said the demonstration unit was built from Volt parts and has been disassembled and parts have been sold.

Councilman Jones said initially the Volt was going to be where the power would come but it was redesigned.

Mr. Bookout said the technology/platform is of a Chevy Volt, the battery capability of a Tracker is reminiscence of a Chevy Volt, dashboard of Tracker is similar to Chevy Volt, using a lot of General Motor parts. This is a demonstration of what Mr. Dannar put together with funds that he received in South Carolina. Unable to secure his capital in South Carolina from a private investor, he shopped the project around the United States. Muncie was a location that he

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-018 RESOLUTION TO COVER SHORTFALL IN FUNDING

WHEREAS, Delaware County Council appropriated funds for the calendar year 2013 and is experiencing a shortfall in the collection of property taxes to cover said funding; and

WHEREAS, to address said shortfall, the County can reduce the appropriated funds in the General Fund in the amount of Three Hundred and Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$330,000.00).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Delaware County, State of Indiana, that:

Councilman Alexander said there was talk in the Finance Meeting that the money would be coming from Capital Improvement fund.

Councilman Spangler asked if this would be for future repairs of ambulances.

Mr. Tim Hutson said yes and right now "we" are in the hole. Hutson said it seems like every day one of the trucks will have something wrong with it. The balance started with \$30,000.

Councilman Quakenbush said this is coming out of 334484 account in which Council voted to take \$50,000 out of, so Council is well below \$300,000.

Councilman Alexander said it was said that it would come out of Capital Improvements.

President Nemyer told Council the plan is to take \$50,000 for Commissioners, (Institutional Care), \$16,000 for EMS (Vehicle Repair) and \$43,000 from Sheriff 129 (gasoline) with a total of \$109,000 that will be taken from EMS Capital Improvement Fund.

Council had questions regarding the amount that has to remain in the fund.

Councilman Quakenbush said he had made a motion at another Council meeting to transfer \$400,000 from EMS Capital Improvement fund, and suggested in the motion to keep a balance of hundred...and some thousand. After that time, Ms.

Denise Smith, Auditors Office, researched and found an ordinance passed by the Commissioners that limited the balance of EMS Capital Improvement fund. Quakenbush is unable to find the ordinance approved by Commissioners but he does not believe the fund can be reduced to the amount Council suggested.

President Nemyer said if that balance could never go under \$100,000 that would mean that there would be \$100,000 always in that fund that could never be spent.

Councilman Quakenbush said he had made a suggestion that the Commissioners write an ordinance and then later found that an ordinance had been written.

Mr. Hutson said he is not aware of an ordinance stating that a certain amount had to remain in the fund. In 1984, when the Capital Improvement fund was created, \$39 per ambulance call was put in the fund to build it up. Two or three years ago, Hutson said, the account was building up faster because the call volumes went up from 7000/8000 to 13,500 and Council needed the money. Instead of taking \$39 per call, we took "x" amount per month and put it into the Capital Improvement account.

Councilman Jones said absent that ordinance, the intent of the ordinance, Jones believed, was to make sure there would be enough money to provide what is needed for EMS. Even though the fund will be depleted, the funding will be available by the time EMS would need funds for an ambulance because it builds back up.

Mr. Hutson said the money will continue to build in the account and even if he ordered an ambulance it would not be available until March 2014, however, Hutson would not order anything until the months added up to the cost of an ambulance.

Ms. Dunnuck said when Councilman Quakenbush accentuated it was a minimum balance limit, Hutson accentuated it was maximum balance limit. If it is a maximum balance, what is being done today will not be in violation of that ordinance or conflict of the ordinance.

Mr. Hutson said he does not know anything that had a minimum balance limit. Councilman Quakenbush confirmed he did suggest that there be a maximum balance so once it hit the maximum balance it would go into the general fund.

Ms. Dunnuck said when you say limit it sounds like it is a maximum balance, not minimum balance.

President Nemyer said if the ordinance set a minimum balance of \$100,000, this would mean \$100,000 in that fund would never be spent.

Mr. Hutson said he would not know why "we" would do that.

Councilman Alexander suggested the transfers on the financial/transfers should be approved first because it will be hard to vote without knowing that the money is there. We would have to take the vote to know the money is there under the scenario.

Councilman Jones requested a recess.

President Nemyer recessed the meeting.

RECESSED-9:28 a.m.-9:43 a.m.

Due to nothing being produced regarding the ordinance, Councilman Jones called for questions.

Councilman Alexander motioned to amend the previous motion because it is now coming out of county general and "this", was coming out of the Capital Improvement fund in transfer, subject to transfer.

Ms. Donna Patterson, Settlement Clerk, spoke but inaudible.

9:43 a.m.

Ms. Dunnuck said there is going to be a motion to transfer \$109,000 from Capital Improvement fund into county general to cover the appropriation that is on the table. Is this correct?

Several Council members answered "yes."

Ms. Dunnuck said the motion could be tabled for \$16,000; someone could make the motion to move the money from Capital Improvements to general fund, once that motion passes then the money is available for additional appropriations. "That may put the cart back behind the horse."

Ms. Patterson said it has to be appropriated out of general fund because that is where it was advertised.

President Nemyer said Councilman Jones motion will be tabled.

MOTION: Councilman Alexander motioned to table.

SECOND: Councilman Quakenbush All Council members were in favor

President Nemyer asked for a motion to move \$109,000 from EMS Capital Improvement to County General fund.

MOTION: Councilman Jones motioned to move \$109,000 from EMS Capital Improvement to County General fund.

Councilman Jones asked Ms. Judy Rust, Auditor, to repeat his motion that was tabled.

Ms. Rust said it was to approve \$16,000 out of vehicle repair out of Emergency Medical Service.

Councilman Quakenbush said Council will need to remove it from the table.

President Nemyer said Councilman Jones was doing that.

MOTION: Councilman Quakenbush motioned to remove the item from the table and to make the motion to appropriate \$16,000 for vehicle repair, line item 364. SECOND: Councilman Jones

President Nemyer said bringing the motion back should be enough.

Councilman Quakenbush said no, it has to be brought off, removed from the table then voted on. The motion has been made, the motion has been seconded and it is time to vote.

Mr. Winkle said \$10,000 was budgeted and that money is gone. The \$8,000 will get through to the end of the year. (Anticipated expenses)

The City will be billed for actual expenses.

President Nemyer said if this is approved, there will be \$8,000 in line item, \$5,000 is spent and City is billed for \$2,500, County \$2500 with \$3,000 left. If this is approved (\$8,000), \$4,000 somewhere else should be cut from the budget.

Councilman Matchett said we are trying to make cuts reducing 2013 budget to get to a break-even point and there is no new money.

Mr. Winkle said he does have people drawing unemployment. It will be close to the \$8,000.

Ms. Judy Rust, said this is a bill that has to be paid.

Councilman Quakenbush is supporting this because Councilman Matchett stated that "we" should not reduce what "we" done before and he voted no on the appropriation.

Ms. Lana Scroggins, Office Manager, asked if this was being taken from computer line item. Ms. Scroggins said there was an emergency that caused damage to an office computer. A request was made through an appropriation and the claim will be coming through for the new computer. There has been so much water damage in Justice Center. Circuit 3 Jury Room, Courtroom, the Humidifier is broken, there is so much odor and it is very unpleasant to be in those room because of water damage. Until the leaks are repaired, there will still be problems. Years ago, we all had office machines, Council took it away creating an Emergency Computer fund. It was in data's budget and then moved to Council's budget. This is a true emergency; the Court Bailiff does not have a computer. The cost will be \$1100 or \$1200.

Councilman Quakenbush did not realize it was Computer Replacement fund and thought it was Contractual. "I will change my vote to no."

Ms. Dunnuck said if you do not want to do something today (August 27, 2013), they will have to redo the same thing net month.

Councilman Quakenbush withdrew his second.

Councilman Alexander withdrew his motion.

President Nemyer said he would be satisfied coming up with \$8,000 at September's Council meeting to have time to review the accounts before committing to anything.

Councilman Jones said if someone does not come forward, Council will make the decision.

Councilman Alexander said \$8,000 does not do a lot.

Councilman Jones said but again if "we" can't cough up \$8,000 to cover the appropriation then we will have to do that much more.

Ms. Pattie Lackey, Executive Administrator, said money balances were taken, however, Department Heads/Elected Officials had budgeted for those accounts.

Ms. Candace Kindt, Soil Health Director, of Delaware County Soil and Water Conservation District introduced herself to Council.

Councilman Alexander said Ameresco would like to present ways to save money for Delaware County according to the Preliminary Energy Audit Report that was presented to the Commissioners.
