#### ADDENDUM

<u>MOTION</u>: Councilman Jones motioned to approve addendum transfer of Commissioners, (See below).

Ms. Pattie Lackey, Executive Assistant, told about mailings going out and balances of accounts and told of the liability that the Commissioners have for Jail equipment and when inmates destroy Jail property.

Councilman Quakenbush spoke about the Health/Insurance meeting he attended and he said the numbers within the Commissioners budget were going to be within \$4,000 of what the cost would be for the clinic. Quakenbush said he was trying to convince the Commissioners that he is not opposed to the Clinic but would like to know where they are going to get the money. Councilman Quakenbush said he was trying to protect that money and put it in the health fund and then if the motion passed Quakenbush was going to ask to reduce the amount in COIT for healthcare for next year by the same amount or at least \$200,000. This would give an additional amount or balance in COIT to depend on for 2014 budget. Councilman Quakenbush said he was not trying to create animosity but trying to move numbers and did not explain himself thoroughly enough. The motivation was sincere. Councilman Quakenbush said institutional care was originally a line item that was not intended to be used to transfer prisoners. The budget item should be in the Sheriff's budget and should not be in the Commissioners budget and should be reviewed when the 2015 budget is done.

Ms. Lackey said according to State statute the Commissioners budget has a lot in it that the Commissioners have absolutely no authority over or nothing to do with it other than how it is paid.

#### Welcome and Introductions Made

#### Introduction of counsel, William "Bill" Kreegar

Rob presented a brief description of Bill's role thus far, and stated that he will have an advisory role if and when a commission is formed at a future date.

Rob also addressed the advance of information through each of the elected officials to their boards and commissions. Minutes will be provided to be read into the record at their meetings or shared publicly, however would be deemed appropriate.

#### Meeting/Presentation

Due to questions from the public and issues and rules of public meetings, Rob addressed the process of the Advisory Board and clarified its purpose: to build a working relationship among the five taxing units, receive information about the options available to the community related to the Mounds Lake proposed project, and receive updates on CED efforts to securing funding for future phases.

A series of public meetings for citizens to ask questions, share concerns and feel more informed. These will be planned in the near future and most likely held in Anderson, Chesterfield and Daleville. A main focus will be the need to obtain more community input on bridges and roads and how they will impact an area. The hope is that elected officials would attend these meetings as well.

Rob shared that he envisions a commission being formed at some point that controls and makes decisions during future phases.

After discussion and input to Phase II funding, the majority felt it prudent to move forward. Rob stated that a public announcement could be made most likely by the end of the month.

#### Conclusion

With Phase II funding pending, the next gatherings will be community impact and planning meetings and the boards and commissions as well as the public will be informed.
