President Matchett said Mr. Terry Murphy, CEcD Vice President of Economic Development withdrew his previous request of presenting the East Central Indiana Ordinance.

Councilman Quakenbush asked that a vote be considered since it was on Junes' agenda.

Ms. Amanda Dunnuck, Council Attorney, said a vote is not needed.

Councilmembers Quakenbush, Alexander and Councilman Jones discussed the ordinance and issues regarding that a regional government would take away local control.

AN ORDINANCE TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE EAST CENTRAL INDIANA REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, legislation effective July 1, 2015, Indiana Code Sec. 36-7.6 et. seq. provides for the establishment of regional development authorities by a county and one or more adjacent counties or qualified cities in adjacent counties; and

WHEREAS, local and regional economic development officials have requested that Delaware County participate in the establishment of the East Central Indiana Regional Development Authority (the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority is to be governed in accordance with Indiana Code Sec. 36-7.6 et. seq. and the Articles of Association and Bylaws ("Bylaws") in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, as such Bylaws may be amended from time-to-time; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code Sec. 36-7.6-2-3(b) permits the fiscal body of a County to establish and become a member of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, this body has determined that the purposes of the Authority benefit and are in the best interests of Delaware County, namely, the Authority's purpose of promoting the acquisition, construction, equipping, owning, leasing, and financing of projects and facilities for lease to or for the benefit of eligible political subdivisions, and the funding and development of (a) airport authority projects, (b) commuter transportation district and other rail projects; (c) regional transportation authority projects and services; (d) economic development projects; (e) intermodal transportation projects; (f) regional trail or greenway projects; and (g) any projects that enhance the region with the goal of attracting people or business that are of regional importance; and

WHEREAS, this body, as the fiscal body of Delaware County, has determined that it is in the best interest of Delaware County to establish and become a member of the Authority as set forth herein, and that such establishment and membership in the Authority will promote economic development and further the well-being of the citizens of Delaware County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that Delaware County, effective July 1, 2015, shall become a member of the East Central Indiana Regional Development Authority, which is being established pursuant to Indiana Code Sec. 36-7.6 et. seq.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that Delaware County approves the Bylaws as the governing instrument of the Authority, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, as such Bylaws may be amended from time-to-time.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS OF HEARING ON PROPOSED CUMULATIVE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT FUND President Matchett asked Council to set a time and date for public hearing.

MOTION: Councilman Nemyer made a motion to advertise the hearing for the proposed Cumulative Capital Development Fund for July 8, 2015 at 4:30 p.m.

SECOND: Councilwoman Chambers
This motion is to advertise the meeting.

Ms. Amanda Dunnuck, Council Attorney said the notice must be published then the public hearing takes place and then a vote for the resolution. The resolution is sent to DLGF for approval of procedures, upon approval the 30 day remonstrance period begins.

Councilman Alexander said he thought they (Council) were trying to reach the budget without raising taxes. Councilman Alexander questioned why this was being presented.

President Matchett said the deadline to pass Cumulative Capital Development Fund was missed last year.

Nemyer said he was in favor of the tax in 2013. It is a tool to compensate for the losses from property tax caps and Nemyer said it should be used.

Alexander said he did not realize what the intent was but is against implementing the tax. Alexander will be out of town from July 8 through July 18 during the scheduled meeting. Alexander said he believes this is a long way from approving or even considering raising taxes to taxpayers. Is Council's attention to push this through before the deadline?

Ms. Dunnuck said steps one, two and three must be submitted to DLGF postmarked by August 1, 2015.

Councilman Quakenbush said why even have a public hearing if it is going to be pushed through.

Councilman Nemyer said it is required by law.

Councilman Jones said discussion should take place more at the public hearing and special meeting.

President Matchett called a Special meeting immediately following the public hearing.

Alexander said he would be available before July 8 or after 18.

Ms. Dunnuck said the notice requirement is that it is published twice; first notice is 10 days advance of hearing and second notice three days before the hearing.

Mr. Keith Royston, Muncie Newspaper confirmed that if information (publication) is provided to the newspaper by the end of the day (June 23, 2015) it will be published on Friday, June 26, 2015.

Dunnuck said the soonest the meeting could be in July 6, 2015.

Alexander said Council is a longs ways from getting the budget to where we need it to even ask taxpayers for more money.

Quakenbush said further discussion can take place at the public hearing and special meeting.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS OF HEARING ON PROPOSED CUMULATIVE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT FUND

Notice is given to the taxpayers of Delaware County Unit, Delaware County, State of Indiana, that the Delaware County Council will consider at their regular meeting place at the Delaware County Building, 100 West Main Street, Muncie, Indiana 47305, at 5:30 o'clock p.m. on the 6th day of July, 2015, the establishment of a Cumulative Capital Development Fund under the provisions of I.C. 36-9-14.5 for the purposes stated therein, including: For all uses as set out in I.C. 36-9-14.5.

The tax will be levied on all taxable real and personal property within the taxing district and will not exceed:

\$.0167 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation payable in year 2016,

\$.0333 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation payable in year 2017 and thereafter, continuing until reduced or rescinded.

Taxpayers appearing at such hearing shall have a right to be heard. The proposal for establishment of the Cumulative Capital Development Fund is subject to the approval by the Department of Local Government Finance, who will require Notice of Submission to be given to the tax payers through publication. Mr. Rick Lorrison, Justice Center Superintendent, said this is for supplies for operation of Justice Center.

Ms. Pattie Lackey, Office Manager, said Council cut the budget last year.

President Matchett said he did not see the cut.

Ms. Lackey said it was line item 369.

Discussion took place with Council about cuts.

Ms. Lackey said the Commissioners budget is always cut the most but at the same time there are a lot of expenses that has to come out that takes care of both buildings.

Examples were given from Ms. Lackey and Mr. Lorrison.

President Matchett said there is still no money.

Mr. Charlie Walker, Superintendent, said this was brought to the attention of Council members when the cuts were made. To operate the buildings it was told that \$15,000 and \$20,000 would not be enough. The bills coming in will be on Council because it has to be done and there is not money.

MOTION: Councilman Jones amended motion to take money from Institutional Care.

Ms. Lackey said there is no money available because it will be needed to pay Institutional Care. Some have been housed out of county and paying double what we paid Community Corrections plus BBI account.

Councilman Quakenbush said the Sheriff had the plan to pay for it.

Ms. Dunnuck said there are several plans. The Commissioners and Sheriff have their own plan.

Continued discussion took place regarding plans and funding of Home Detention, Community Corrections.

SECOND: Councilman Nemyer

The first motion and second has been withdrawn.

Councilman Quakenbush said previous President, Mr. Jones was adamant to work with Commissioners to resolve issues with EDIT fund. EDIT funds have been released by the State to be used for different things. Quakenbush said when budgets were cut, Council was making a statement that Council needed Commissioners help and we were not getting it. Quakenbush said now the Commissioners Executive Assistant coming here pleading her case for money that is needed (Council agrees) but Council needs help from EDIT fund.

Ms. Sherry Riggin, Commissioner President, said she had to come to defend Rick, Charlie and Pattie. The Cumulative building fund is a perfect example because roofs of buildings are leaking, sidewalks and steps are in need of being redone. Riggin said EDIT has been committed. Land is going to be sold and Ms. Riggin said her wish is taking some of that money to do investments in properties. Equipment at the Highway is desperately needed. Riggin said a new EDIT plan will be presented in June and things could be readjusted.

President Matchett said if CCD fund is implemented, some of the repairs can be paid from this. Building repairs of \$70,000 have been submitted.

Discussion continued regarding repairs, office supplies and living within the budget.

This vote is the request to amend and take it out of Institutional Care. Motion PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

Amendment motion of taking \$20,000 from Institutional Care. Motion PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

President Matchett said it is coming to the point that when new money is needed, the question asked is how many employees are you willing to give up because the county is out.

Ms. Donna Patterson, Settlement Clerk, confirmed that with that vote, authorization for Auditor's office is to do the transfer.

Ms. Dunnuck said transfer from Institutional Care to JC Maintenance.

MOTION: Councilwoman Chambers motioned to approve \$6500 for Election Board.

SECOND: Councilwoman Lasater Motion PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

MOTION: Councilman Jones motioned to approve \$64,898.92 for Communication Center,

SECOND: Councilwoman Lasater

A lot of consideration was given at Finance Committee, after good discussion it was determined that Council supports and gave a favorable recommendation. Four out of eight part-time employees will reduce that amount and savings due to reduction in overtime.

Mr. Joe Winkle, 911 Director, said savings will show in the next couple of years. When the amount of hours allowed by law changed for part-time employees it became an issue. This should eliminate money

put into training part-time employees only to lose them to a full-time offer with benefits and allowing Supervisors to supervise instead of being back-up for breaks.

Ms. Linda Michael, Muncie, Indiana, presented information about "back yard breeding" and asked as a taxpayer of Delaware County that officials help regulate back yard breeding. A requirement fee, license or dog fee are not required in Delaware County and should be.

COMPUTERS

Mr. Jim Flook, IT Director, came before Council on behalf of Prosecutor IV-D office. The office is running on XP operating system and an upgrade has to be done. Delaware County has 445 PC's and 252 have been replaced.

Councilman Alexander said Mr. Jeff Arnold, Prosecutor, is willing to pay half of the cost. The other half, if approved could come out of PC emergency fund. Total cost would be \$8600 and should be implemented by the end of August 2015. Councilman Alexander said he and Mr. Flook will come before Council in July regarding computer replacements. As new software is installed, there will be more that are going to have to be replaced. The old software will not support XP. Funding was found on all but \$40,000 to complete the project.

MOTION: Councilman Alexander made a motion to use \$4300 out of computer replacement fund.
