# **DELAWARE COUNTY BRIDGE #516 INSPECTION CONTRACT 6-29-2016**

Ms. Moyer, Project Manager, presented the standard INDOT LPA - Consulting Contract for construction inspection with HWC Engineering for Bridge 516. Letting is scheduled for January 2017. The maximum amount payable under this contract is not to exceed \$379,762.75. Local match is 20% or \$75,952.55.

Ms. Moyer also presented a LPA – Consulting Contract, Supplemental Agreement No. 2 with HWC Engineering for environmental services for a \$0.00 change. Originally, the project included a CE Level 4 document based on expected R/W and the adjacent park but through intuitive design and an interlocal agreement for R/W access a lower level of CE was obtained at a cost savings. However, the environmental coordination found that the White River is listed impaired for PCB's at the bridge location. Ms. Moyer recommends having soil samples taken now to reduce the risk of higher construction bids.

MOTION: Commissioner King made a motion to approve presented the LPA Bridge 516 inspection and supplemental contracts.

Commissioner Riggin said she has a problem with the engineering company working on the project, due to the same engineering company has been working on Smithfield Bridge for the last 14 years.

We understand that Delaware County will rely upon the professional opinions and representations contained in the report. This reliance is not to be construed as a warranty or guarantee on the part of SME.

Please note that the User acquiring a property is the sole party responsible for complying with AAI requirements for Landowner Liability Protections (LLPs) under CERCLA. LLPs include the Bona Fide Prospective Purchaser (BFPP), Contiguous Property Owner, or Innocent Landowner defense to CERCLA liability. The completion of a Phase I ESA and report, with a signed statement by an Environmental Professional (EP) that it is compliant with AAI and/or the ASTM E 1527-13 Standard, may not be sufficient to provide LLP to CERCLA.
