WHEREAS, Fieldware is engaged in the business of providing an automated supervision management service (hereinafter referred to as "OffenderLink<sup>TM</sup>") through the use of an integrated web-based case management system and an automated telephone-based offender reporting and notification system whereby Agency clients (hereinafter referred to as "Clients") make periodic contact; and

NOW THEREFORE, in exchange for the mutual consideration set forth in this Agreement, Fieldware and Agency agree as follows:

Fieldware agrees to the following additional provisions according to Indiana Administrative Rule 9(1):

- (I) Contracts With Vendors Providing Information Technology Services Regarding Court Records.
- (1) If a court or other private or governmental entity contracts with a vendor to provide information technology support to gather, store, or make accessible Court Records, the contract will require the vendor to comply with the intent and provisions of this access policy. For purposes of this section, the term "vendor" also includes a state, county, or local governmental agency that provides information technology services to a court.
- (2) Each contract shall require the vendor to assist the court in its role of educating litigants and the public about this rule. The vendor shall also be responsible for training its employees and subcontractors about the provisions of this rule.
- (3) Each contract shall prohibit vendors from disseminating bulk or Compiled Information, without first obtaining approval as required by this Rule.
- (4) Each contract shall require the vendor to acknowledge that Court Records remain the property of the court and are subject to the directions and orders of the court with respect to the handling and access to the Court Records, as well as the provisions of this rule.
- (5) These requirements are in addition to those otherwise imposed by law.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2018 - 001

ONGINGL

BEING AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TEXT OF THE SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE OF DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA REGARDING PROCEDURES FOR MINOR PLATS, NOTICE AND MINOR TRANSFERS OF PROPERTY

- WHEREAS, the State enabling act for planning and zoning empowers the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana to adopt a Subdivision Control Ordinance and also provides for amendments to said ordinances as deemed necessary from time to time; and
- WHEREAS, the State enabling act also provides for amendments to further promote the public health, safety and general welfare; and
- WHEREAS, the current provisions require updating or clarification; and
- WHEREAS, the Delaware-Muncie Metropolitan Plan Commission has given legal notice of a public hearing and, after consideration of the proposed amendments during the hearing, hereby forwards a favorable recommendation (5-0; 4 absent) regarding said amendment to the County Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana, all as required by law; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana has given reasonable regard to the Comprehensive Plan; current conditions and the character of current structures and uses in each district; the most desirable use for which land in each district is adapted; the conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction; and responsible growth and development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana that the text of the Delaware County Subdivision Control Ordinance shall be amended, changed and supplemented as follows:

Section 1. That Article XVIII DEFINITIONS of the Subdivision Ordinance of Delaware County, Indiana, shall be amended and supplemented by inserting the following sentence at the end of Section 28. SUBDIVISION, Subsection A.: "The sale or exchange of small parcels of land to or between adjoining property owners or the sale or exchange of a part or parts of adjoining lots within a platted subdivision, where such sales or exchanges do not create additional lots or building sites, shall not be considered a subdivision for the purpose of this Ordinance."

Section 2. That Article XIV PROCEDURE, Section 2. PRELIMINARY PLAN, Subsection F of the Subdivision Ordinance of Delaware County, Indiana, shall be amended by deleting the phrase "in at least one (1) newspaper of local circulation at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of the hearing" and replacing it with the phrase "in accordance with state law".

Section 3. That Article XIV PROCEDURE shall be amended and supplemented by adding a Section 4 at the end as follows:

WHEREAS, there are several properties in Delaware county that are severely delinquent in the payment of property taxes, having been offered for tax sales and which received no bids equal to or in excess of minimum sale price. The parcel numbers of those properties being attached to this as "Exhibit A", and

WHEREAS, there is an assessed value associated with these properties for taxation purposes, but no taxes are being collected, therefore causing a lower than expected tax distribution to those taxing units and taxing districts within which the properties are located, and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Commissioners desire to have these properties back on the tax rolls with taxes being collected, and

WHEREAS, ICG-1.1-24-6, et seq. allows for the County Commissioners to acquire a lien on those delinquent properties and receive issuance of the tax sale certificates for those properties, without taking title to the properties, therefore limiting the liability and cost normally associated with taking title

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Delaware County Board of Commissioners that the County Executive shall acquire liens and receive tax sale certificates of the properties listed on <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> that are severely delinquent and sell said certificates at a properly advertised Commissioner Tax Certificate sale.

Mr. Dave Ring, Mr. Robert Ray, Mr. Doug Short, Mr. Travis Graves and Mr. Jim Harker, spoke regarding the proposed confined animal feed operation. Mr. Ring would like a moratorium.

Mr. Ray said concerns are clean air, safe drinking water, high erosions, rolling hills, keeping soil productive is a concern. Homes in the area could lose their value.

Commissioners February 5, 2018

Mr. Short requests that no local permits be issued until they meet with Plan Commissioner. County roads, bridges, culverts, draining, flooding, an increased traffic and weight limits are a concern. A packet was provided to Mr. Henry.

Mr. Graves is concerned about CAFO's. Graves said it is not good for the environment and has a negative effect on Delaware County. Gainful employment would not come from CAFO's. This is the responsibility for the Commissioners to stop CAFO's.

Mr. Harker said this is not farming, CAFO's are industry and a massive operation. A moratorium should be in place to protect constituents. This is not good for water, roads, infrastructure, environmental issues etc. Mr. Harker asks for a total ban or a moratorium.

Ms. Marta Moody, Plan Commission, said this would deal with home/local requirements through the zoning ordinance. A meeting is set to review requirements. One main tool used is setbacks for uses. A moratorium is usually due to a short term of time while addressing the issue.

The Commissioners have been in discussion with their attorney, Mr. John Brooke regarding this matter.

Mr. Rick Yencer said there is a need for more early voting sites for 2018.
