**ORDINANCE 2017-008
DELAWARE COUNTY COUNCIL**

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH USES FOR APPROPRIATIONS FROM DELAWARE COUNTY SHERIFF INTERDICTION REVENUE ACCOUNT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code 34-24-1 money seized, and proceeds received from the sale of property seized, by local law enforcement for a violation of certain criminal statutes may be received by the unit as reimbursement for their costs associated with such seizures; and


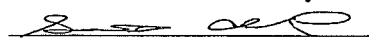
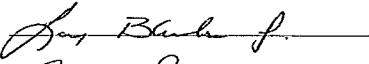
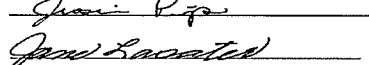

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2012-012, the Delaware County Commissioners created the Delaware County Sheriff Interdiction Revenue Account within the Delaware County General Fund for the deposit of such money and proceeds; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Council, as the fiscal body of the County, wishes to establish the uses for which moneys can be appropriated from the Account.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE DELAWARE COUNTY COUNCIL that:

1. The moneys deposited in the Delaware County Sheriff Interdiction Revenue Account within the Delaware County General Fund may be appropriated by the Delaware County Council for the following law enforcement related uses:
 - a. Special training for a law enforcement officer;
 - b. Victim assistance;
 - c. Office equipment, computers, computer software, communications devices, office machinery, furnishings and office supplies;
 - d. Expenses of a criminal investigation;
 - e. Any activity or program operated by the Delaware County Sheriff that is intended to reduce or prevent criminal activity, including:
 - i. Substance abuse;
 - ii. Human trafficking/Prostitution;
 - f. Any other purpose that benefits law enforcement and is designated by an amended Court order and approved by the Delaware County Council upon request of the Delaware County Sheriff.
2. This ordinance is effective upon adoption.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Jeff Arnold, Prosecutor, presented information urging county officials to oppose any efforts for the local needle exchange program for Delaware County. Mr. Arnold displayed the exchange kit before Council.

Mr. Jason Rogers, EMS and Mr. Ray Dudley, Sheriff are in agreement with Mr. Arnold and do not want a needle exchange program in Delaware County.

MOTION: Councilman Matchett made a motion for Mr. Bill Hughes, Council Attorney, to draft a resolution opposing the needle exchange program. This will be presented during Mays Council meeting.

AUDIENCE COMMENTS

Councilman Bledsoe wanted clarification on the Drop Program and the addendum. When the Pension fund was created, Bledsoe assumed it was between the County Commissioners and the Sheriff. Would the addendum be for that contract or is there an ordinance already on the books that allow the funding for the Pension Plan. If it is not the (Council) body to approve, then the Sheriff would need to forward it to the Commissioners.

Mr. Hughes said it is in the form of an amendment to the Police Retirement Plan and was approved by the Council body. Mr. Hughes said this would not go to the Commissioners.

Councilman Bledsoe said all contracts must be approved by the Commissioners.

Mr. Hughes said other than the proposed amendment Mr. Hughes only has the Plan that was approved in April 2015.

Mr. John Holding, Sheriff Department, said it is based off of State law and he does not think it goes to the Commissioners. Council along with Merit Board both approve any changes to the Pension Plan.

Councilman Bledsoe said if this is the case then he recommended the DROP program, unless Mr. Hughes has not had a chance to review the plan and amendment.

Mr. Hughes said he reviewed the amendment and the plan itself; however Mr. Hughes has not contacted Mr. Stan Brown McCready and Keene, Inc. (Actuary) that attended March Council meeting.

Councilman Bledsoe wants to get the Drop Program approved. The plan was in for the attorney to review.

President Quakenbush read the document and said he was somewhat confused and had questions. Mr. Hughes will research it further but Quakenbush said he is not ready for a vote. He does not know how other Council members feel about a vote. It is not so much the action but how it will affect the County financially. Going through the process does not address what happens when a high ranking officer is allowed to claim they are going to retire in three years. It doesn't address what happens when the officer leaves and someone is hired at a lower rank. In Quakenbush experience, then the lower ranking officer is promoted. A stipulation may be considered for a cooling off period.

Mr. Holding said the savings is that in 2010 Council, Sheriff and Merit Board made changes to the retirement plan. This gets the higher plan Deputies out and replacing them with Deputies with less benefits. The payment on the end doesn't cost the plan any more money because that money is already accounted for in the plan. Their retirement is that day and their money goes into an escrow account that they get when they leave in three years. It is saving the county money because those coming in afterwards are in a lower rate plan.

Councilman Bledsoe said once they sign up, it freezes their plan.

President Quakenbush told Council they should read the plan and questions should be given to Mr. Hughes. Quakenbush questioned the 6% interest.

Mr. Holding said the provision in the drop plan is that the money going into escrow can draw up to 3% for the Deputy but it was elected to leave it at 0 and let the plan draw the interest.

Councilman Bledsoe said he has met twice and it was to be discussed during April's meeting.

President Quakenbush said a follow-up meeting was to take place. No one contacted Mr. Hughes regarding questions.

Councilwoman Lasater asked if it could be tabled until May.

Councilman Bledsoe said yes, but he will make a motion in May.

President Quakenbush reminded Council to sign the nepotism certification and file it in the Commissioner's office.

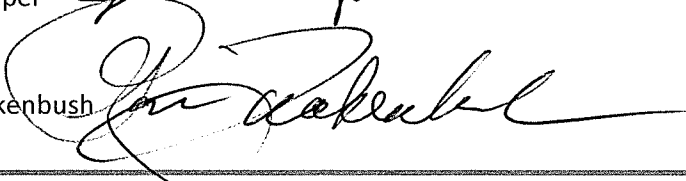
