LIVING GREEN FARM, INC. RESOLUTION #2022-023

Mr. Brad Bookout, Director of Economic Development, offered congratulations to Councilmember Chambers, Councilmember Quakenbush and Councilmember Ballard with their future endeavors.

Mr. Bookout presented Living Green Farm, Inc. tax abatement, located at 2450 Fuson Road, Muncie, Indiana. The Tax Abatement committee voted unanimously in favor of the tax abatement. Living Green Farm, Inc. will purchase new equipment with an estimated cost of \$31,696,226. This is a three-year phased in tax abatement. A business may be up and running but growth and future contracts of the company may not be viable without the ability to redevelop and add new machinery. This is separate from the first original investment. Mr. Bookout said all application information has been provided.

Mr. Jerry Gray, Plant Engineer, said this is great for the future of Delaware County, phasing into the future with farming. The company is tied into fresh Thyme, Walmart's and all will be based out of Indiana. After harvest the product (lettuce) will be delivered within 24 hours. No pesticides are in the product and Living Green Farm, Inc. is aeroponic.

Mr. Ben Freeman, Council Attorney, said the property is already in an economic revitalization area that has been approved.

RESOLUTION APPROVING DEDUCTION FROM ASSESSED VALUE FOR PERSONAL PROPERTY IN AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2014-008, adopted February 25, 2014, the Delaware County Council ("Council") designated the property located at 2450 W. Fusion Road, Muncie, Indiana (Parcel No. 18-11-29-400-028.000-002) (the "Real Estate"), as an economic revitalization area for purposes of establishing deductions from assessed value of real and personal property;

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2014-026, adopted March 25, 2014, after due notice and a public hearing, the Council confirmed the designation of the Real Estate as an economic revitalization area; and

WHEREAS, Living Greens Farm, Inc. has filed an Application for Tax Abatement and submitted a Statement of Benefits ("Application") for the purchase of new personal property to be installed upon the Real Estate;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

- The Council finds and determines that the Application meets the requirements for tax abatement for personal property.
- Living Greens Farm, Inc. is granted a deduction from assessed value for the new personal property to be installed upon the Real Estate for three (3) years in accordance with the following schedule:

1ST 100%
2 ND 100%
3 RD 66%
4 Th and thereafter 0%

- 3. Living Greens Farm, Inc. shall comply with all requirements of Indiana law to maintain eligibility for the tax abatement. Living Greens Farm, Inc. shall update the Council with respect to the status of the project, as well as employment, wage and benefit projections set forth in the Application throughout the term of the tax abatement and as requested by the Council.
- The Auditor of Delaware County shall take such further actions as may be required to carry out the purposes of this Resolution.
- 5. This Resolution shall be effective upon passage.

ARC EDM, Inc.

RESOLUTION 2022-024, DECLARING AN AREA WITHIN CENTER TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY Mr. Bookout presented ARC EDM, Inc. tax abatement, located at 1800 West Mount Pleasant Boulevard, Muncie, Indiana. Mr. Daniel and Ms. Ashley Miller are the owners and operators of ARC EDM, Inc. The Millers would like to purchase a Titan Force axis drilling machine. The cost of the machine is \$269,000. Mr. Bookout said all application information has been provided. The Tax Abatement committee voted unanimously in favor of the tax abatement.

Mr. Miller said they are wanting to purchase an EDM (electrical discharge machine). The drill can make holes into hardened steel carbide along with many other options and sizes of holes. The Millers' are hoping to get into the Aerospace industry and will bring work in from GE, Roll-Royce, Boeing etc. The EDM is built in New York. This machine is adding to the business.

Councilmember Webb asked about ERA area. He thought tax abatements were for new business coming into town.

Mr. Bookout said a tax abatement can also be for an existing business that is operating and profitable. The growth and future contracts of the company makes it viable to add new machinery. This also is an option to compete globally creating new business. This is a five-year abatement, phased in savings on this machine would be \$10,530. An ERA can certainly be done of the whole area; however, Mr. Bookout does not want to blanket the whole area. He has always provided Council of ERA, as needed.

A Public Hearing will take place on December 13, 2022 for public comments, once the Public Hearing is closed and approved then the approval of the tax abatement will take place. This is a two-step process.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022- 034

A RESOLUTION DECLARING AN AREA WITHIN CENTER TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA AS AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA

(ARC EDM, INC.)

WHEREAS, ARC EDM, INC. (the "Company") has filed an Application for Tax Abatement and submitted a Statement of Benefits for the purchase of new personal property;

WHEREAS, the Application for Tax Abatement states that the personal property will be installed on 4,32 acres of real estate located at 1800 W. Mt. Pleasant Blvd, Muncic, Indiana (Parcel No. 18-11-29-200-025.000-002) ("Real Estate") as further described in the map attached hereto as Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Council, is the Designating Body authorized under the provisions of I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-1 et seq. (the "Act") to designate an ERA pursuant to procedures established by law; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Council believes it is in the best interests of the citizens of Delaware County, Indiana, to designate economic revitalization areas in order to expand the property tax base, promote private investment, and create and maintain jobs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

- The Application and Statement of Benefits submitted by the Company are in proper form and deemed complete as filed.
- The Real Estate where the personal property will be located is within Delaware County, Indiana, and has become undesireable for normal growth and development.
- 3. The Council finds as follows:
 - a. The estimate of the value of the of the proposed project is reasonable for projects of that nature.
 - The estimate of the number of individuals who will be employed or retained can reasonably be expected to result from the project.
 - c. The estimate of the annual salaries of the individuals who will be employed or retained can reasonably be expected to result from the project.
 - d. Other benefits as shown on the Application can reasonably be expected to result from the project.
 - e. The totality of the benefits is sufficint to justify the deductions as requested.

4. The Council hereby designates the Real Estate, as shown and legally described in Exhibit A, as an economic revitalization area for purposes of establishing a deduction to the assessed value of new manufacturing equipment to be installed thereon.

5. The deductions provided by this resolution shall be for the project for a period of five (5) years from the date of the assessment of the new manufacturing equipment installed upon the real estate as follows:

6. The Delaware County Auditor shall cause notice of the adoption and substance of this Resolution and setting a public hearing to be held on Tuesday, December 13, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. local time, in the Commissioner's Court Room, Third Floor, Delaware County Building, 100 West Main Street, Muncie, Indiana, to be published in the Muncie StarPress and shall file a copy of the notice and a copy of the Statement of Benefits with each taxing unity that has authority to levy property taxes in the geographic area where the real estate is located.

7. This Resolution shall be effective upon passage, subject to the public hearing and adoption of a resolution to confirm, modify or rescind this Resolution.

He comes up with many ideas but also comes up with ways to pay for the ideas and to receive grants. Training takes place but basically everything has been changed, the mood in the center is completely different.

Ms. Donna Patterson, Settlement Clerk, said discussion took place about giving separate numbers and calling it a stipend. This way it would be clearer. This would be a one-time pay. Deputy Director-125 and Director-124.

Councilmember Ballard said this stipend is coming from a state fund and is not coming from county general. Ballard agreed with Ms. Patterson.

Councilmember Quakenbush is saying instead of transferring it elsewhere in the budget then it should go back. Councilmember Quakenbush said this allows the county to go through the rest of year. In 1981 Quakenbush was told they would have to go through self-insurance. Insurance is big dollars. When departments have money left it needs to go back into 4701.

Mr. Steven Craycraft, Auditor, said other bills should not be paid out of the insurance line. When you spend \$150,000 out of it and now they are asking for \$300,000 out of it. If it is budgeted as insurance then it should be used for insurance.

Ms. Honeycutt said this is the first year that the Commissioners have not had extra to go back into 4701. Ms. Honeycutt said to Mr. Craycraft's point, it was brought up in Finance as well, as if there is a missed budget but the \$300,000 is for 4701. Yes, bills get paid out of that budget but Ms. Honeycutt does not have access to 4701 in VIP. Ms. Honeycutt does not have any capabilities to monitor.

President Piper agreed to not move around the 4701.
