PRESENTATIONS

DELAWARE COUNTY SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT – SWCD BOARD OF SUPERVISORS Mr. Colby Gray, Project Manager, Mr. John Newby, Treasurer, Ms. Clair Burt, District Director, and Ms. Tara Wessekr, Dept of Agriculture, attended the Commissioners meeting to ask that SWCD be placed back into the budget for 2024. Delaware County is the only county in the state of Indiana that does not help support SWCD. Council cut SWCD from the budget in 2008.

Commissioner Riggin said Delaware County should consider supporting SWCD and asked if Economic Development Income Tax (EDIT) or American Rescue Plan (ARP) could be used.

Mr. John Brooke, County Attorney, said it would be better to use EDIT.

Commissioner King asked the salary of the Director and asked how much of the \$50,000 would go to the Director?

Mr. Gray said the Director is part-time but the average around the state is \$45,000 to \$65,000, depending upon technical skills and their job description of duties.

Ms. Wessekr said with the same county size as Delaware County they (another county) would have two to three staff and then the Director. They are held accountable by State Board of Accounts.

Commissioner King does not want \$40,000 to go to the Director and then \$10,000 to something else. This had happened before, in which the Commissioners think it is going to one program, however it goes to another or to administration. Commissioner King does not want it to go to administration and asks for a breakdown. Commissioner King told SWCD they could add it to the 2024 budget and then present it before Council.

Commissioner meeting held May 22, 2023

Commissioner Riggin said they could prorate the donation for 2023.

Mr. Gray said they would certainly work with the Commissioners regarding the request.

Mr. Brooke said he would meet with Ms. Sara Hodges, Commissioners Executive Assistant, to review EDIT funds regarding SWCD.

AMERICA'S HOMETOWN BAND

Mr. Roger McConnell, Music Director of America's Hometown Band, announced the 2023 programs for the community. Mr. McConnell said they are a local band and the goal is to offer musical arts within Delaware County. Mr. McConnell asked that the Commissioners consider support of \$25,000. There are many county related celebrations during the summer of 2023.

Mr. Brooke will review the EDIT plan.

TOGETHER DM PLAN - MUNCIE ACTION PLAN

Ms. Heather Williams, Together DM Plan, said after discussion from the last Commissioners meeting, Muncie Action Plan wants to move forward with the plan by getting names of representatives, per the request from the Commissioners of towns and farms. Ms. Marta Moody was moving this plan forward, Ms. Williams explained in details of how the part-time staff members and administrative coordinator are utilizing the operations of the nonprofit, grant writing and reporting. Ms. Williams said they are looking for \$10,000 to support the administrative side and to move forward with the plan.

MOTION: Commissioner King said he and Ms. Hodges did find the funds in EDIT and made a motion to approve \$10,000.

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT did, on December 20, 2021 enter into a PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT with the CLIENT for Professional Services and Documents in relation to the following described project:

Delaware County Regional Wastewater Sewer Extension to Shell Buildings Property

This supplement is required to amend the following services included in the original scope of work (under Additional Services), due to the addition of land acquisition services in securing three (3) easements through private properties owned by SSA Delaware LLC, Budget Inn USA Inc., and S K R F Properties.

WHEREAS, in order to provide for completion of the work it is necessary to amend and supplement the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT.

NOW, THEREFORE, It is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- I. Appendix "A" is amended to read as follows:
 - Additional Services regarding land acquisition management shall be revised as follows:

Additional Services

- UNITED CONSULTING shall provide land acquisition services that will include:
 - a. APPRAISING
 - UNITED CONSULTING shall provide appraisers that are state certified or licensed by the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency to complete the appraisal work.

- ii. Each Appraiser shall be familiar with the plans for this project and the proposed easements herein designated.
- The Appraiser shall give the owner of each easement to be appraised the opportunity to accompany the Appraiser during the inspection of the easement.
- iv. The appraisals shall follow accepted principles and techniques in evaluation of real property in accordance with the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP).

b. BUYING

- i. UNITED CONSULTING shall provide a Right-of-Way Buyer to present the CLIENT's offer for the required land to each property owner. The Buyer shall be a licensed real estate broker in the state of Indiana.
- ii. This work shall not be sublet, assigned, or otherwise performed by anyone other than the Buyer.
- iii. The Right-of-Way Buyer must be able to explain the project, the acquisition, the impact of the acquisition to the residue, the offer, and negotiate in an honest and competent manner with the property owner.
- iv. The Right-of-Way Buyer must document all contacts with the owner and treat all property owners fairly with respect and dignity.

C. RIGHT-OF-WAY MANAGEMENT

- UNITED CONSULTING shall be responsible for administering, scheduling, and coordinating the activities necessary to certify that the easements have been acquired and the project is clear for construction. The responsibility shall include:
 - Meetings, conferences, and coordination with property owners, attorneys, engineers, appraisers, buyers, and the CLIENT.
 - UNITED CONSULTING shall coordinate the delivery of payment to each property owner.

ORDINANCES FOR FIRST READING CREATING A NEW FUND FOR LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES ORDINANCE 2023-015

Mr. Bane presented Ordinance 2023-015, Creating a New Fund for Local Public Health Services. This is state money that will be received January 2024 and a fund will need to created. The fund is the result from the Governor's Public Health Commission. This is a game changing amount of money for anyone in Indiana Public Health. Delaware County is eligible for \$1.3 million in 2024 and \$2.6 million in 2025. This will replace the annual \$116,000 per year. Attached are the requirements. The Commissioners have until September 1, 2023 to opt in/out, Mr. Bane requests that the Commissioners opt in. The creation of the fund will not obligate the Commissioners, but it will allow Mr. Bane to create an expenditure for these funds by July 1, 2023. The county match is what Council allots to the Health Department every year. Initially for 2024 the state wants an average of the past three years of funding, \$840,000 which is less than what was received in 2023. Going into 2025, it is a 20% match of \$545,000. This would be \$300,000 savings to Delaware County. Mr. Bane would request from Council that in 2025 that the Health Department is budgeted at the same amount as 2024, as a precaution while we ensure that 2026 will be funded by the legislature. If council cuts the Health Department to \$540,000 there is no going back to \$800,000. This would ensure that Public Health Services can continue in Delaware County.

DEPARTMENT HEADS AND ELECTED OFFICIALS

Mr. Chuck Zimmers, Director of High-Tech Crimes Unit, said a few months ago the Commissioners had approved expansion of space for the High-Tech Crimes Unit office. Mr. Zimmers department is within the Prosecutors office, located at the Justice Center.

After approval, further discussions took place regarding the office space on the 3rd floor of the county building. This would be a potential place for hosting training and free up space for the Prosecutors office. Mr. Zimmers would like approval from the Commissioners to be in the open space on the southwest corner of the third floor at the county building. The State is giving High Tech Units additional funding.

Commissioner Riggin said the courtroom and electrical is already in that specific area.

Mr. Zimmers said that certain portions would need to be gutted and secured due to evidence and no funding from the Commissioners would be needed. The state is providing grant money.

President Henry said Mr. Zimmers contacted him regarding the space and agreed that this is a good spot.
