Ms. Carrie Dye, Highway Office Manager, said old equipment was sold through govdeals and that money was put towards purchasing a mower head. APPOINTMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilmember Hughes said the process of the "Rules of the Delaware County Council" started with the help of Councilmember Lasater in the beginning of 2023. Due to Councilmember Lasater's death, Councilmember Flanagan stepped in to assist. The initial draft went out to Councilmembers in March.

MOTION: Councilmember Hughes made a motion to approve "Rules of the Delaware County Council" with one correction.

SECOND: Councilmember Whitehead

Councilmember Webb said he has requested that the budget hearings go live. All Councilmembers attended the State called conference and it was announced that starting July 2025 all meetings must be live streamed. Webb would like to have budget hearings live and asked if this was something that could be placed in "Rules of the Delaware County Council."

Councilmember Flanagan said this isn't in the "Rules of the Delaware County Council" now and the meetings are live streamed so he doesn't find it necessary to place it in the "Rules of the Delaware County Council".

President Piper said a quote is needed before an appropriation or transfer can be done regarding recording the budget meeting.

Councilmember Kantz said the "Rules of the Delaware County Council" could be amended at a later date if necessary.

Councilmember Hughes said house enrolled act 1167 will require that all meetings are livestreamed, effective July 2025.

Mr. Ben Freeman, Council Attorney, said Executive meetings will have to be live streamed and other bodies that meet in the room. If a meeting takes place outside of courtroom then this would not need to be live streamed.

President Piper said this should be placed in the budget.

NEW BUSINESS DM PLAN

Mr. Mitch Issacs, President of Muncie Action Plan and Vice President, Ms. Heather Williams, presented the DM Plan. Mr. Issacs is asking for nominations for the steering committee and wanted to include Councilmembers. Mr. Issacs said no more than 10 would be needed. Commissioner King proposed a member from each town. This is the counties plan so Mr. Issacs asked for Councilmembers recommendations.

President Piper asked that Councilmembers come up with five community members that are interested in serving on boards.

MICROVOTE

Mr. Rick Spangler, Delaware County Clerk, said new voting machines will be placed into the 2024 budget. One machine out of each of the recent election have had fatal errors. Nothing was lost; however, it is time to replace the 20-year-old machines. The mandated equipment (voting machine case and vvpat) are being paid by the state, however, the voting panels are at the expense of Delaware County.

Mr. Steve Shamo, Microvote Representative, said the new panel for the voting system has three components for Presidential election that is mandated by the state, the panel itself has been updated. The difference is only the screen presentation itself. The cost is \$669,000 for the panels. Mr. Shemo provided details of what the new panels offer and said there is a one-year warranty, however, Mr. Shemo recommended asking for a four-year warranty. A 20-week span is needed for the new voting system. The panel is much easier for the voter. Rather than mixing and matching, Microvote would rather that the payments are split so that the equipment is all uniform. This makes the training dramatically easier and all are trained on the same platform. Two audits are available with the machines.

Councilmember Hughes said he is always grateful for Microvote, the training and reliability of machine.

The full amount will be placed in the budget, but Mr. Spangler said the amount can always be adjusted.

Mr. Spangler reminded Councilmembers that Microvote supports Delaware County in every election so Delaware County is not only buying equipment but also service.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS

Mr. Jeff Hansard, Chief Adult Probation Officer, said J.D.A.I. and Muncie Police Department will be hosting a "free" Tuhey Pool Fun Day from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 29, 2023.

Mr. Jeff Hansard provided a six-month update on J.U.M.P. Economic is the biggest impact. Work shortages have been addressed and are going well. J.U.M.P. is promoted through the Probation Department, however, Ivy Tech is working in collaboration with Delaware County and this is a positive solution for the department and county. Mr. Hansard said their clients often deal with a lot of barriers and struggles in life and this is really helping their clients to a solution. More employers, however, are needed. Mr. Hansard thanked Councilmembers for their support.

Ms. Emily Stults, Employment and Education Coordinator, said as of June 2023 they have 217 participants, 78 who are looking to be placed and 41 actively working. Ivy Tech is working as a partnership, Ms. Stacy Bell from Ivy Tech visits three times a week. Ms. Stults and Ms. Bell work together to sign people up for J.U.M.P., college courses etc. giving them the assurance that people are investing into their future. They are working with Muncie Manufacturing Alliance also. Arrowhead Plastics is the biggest employer at this time.

Mr. John Bush, Adult Probation, said he is the author of the program and has been his dream. They are rebranding the program calling it the "Judicial Upward Mobility Partnership Program", reaching out to other employers and not just manufacturing. Mr. Bush said articles have been written about the success of the program. This program is more successful than predicted. Mr. Bush thanked Councilmembers for their support. Fourteen students will graduate at Ivy Tech on July 11, 2023. Mr. Bush said right now they are currently only working with Delaware County Court but are in great hopes that soon they will be working with City of Muncie Courts. The state is monitoring the program closely. Many counties have shown interest in shadowing this program.

Ms. Anderson said the state is already monitoring the program and asked for a round of applause for Mr. Bush.

Audience applauded.

Mr. Polk, Treasurer, asked for a moment of silence for Ms. Susie Dillion. Ms. Dillion worked for Delaware County for many years and recently passed away.

Mr. Jeff Stanley, Chief Deputy, said after many months of work, the federal inmate contract has been signed and will go into effect July 1, 2023.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Charlize Jamieson, Muncie, Indiana, said Happy Pride Month. Ms. Jamieson is not happy that Councilmembers have not acted against Councilmember Webb regarding inappropriate and personal issues toward Ms. Jamieson. Ms. Jamieson read into record a message from Councilmember Webb.

Mr. Rick Yencer, Muncie, Indiana, talked about ethics in Muncie and the gender issue in Delaware County. Mr. Yencer said there is still a serious overdose in the community. The state handed Delaware County several million dollars to help with the situation. Delaware County should help the hungry and homeless more. The usual needs to do more to the road is what he is hearing. Mr. Yencer thanked Council for what they do.

Mr. Kristopher Bilbrey, Muncie, Indiana, is happy to hear that discussion has taken place on house bill 1167. The budget meeting, in his opinion, is one of the most important meetings. Mr. Bilbrey is willing to train anyone within the county "free" to run the equipment. This could be done in-house. Mr. Bilbrey asked that Councilmembers vote in July regarding recording the 2024 budget meetings.

COMMENTS FROM COUNCIL

President Piper said all Councilmembers attended the state called ICCA conference. Budget Hearings take place Wednesday, September 6, 2023. Conflict of interest forms should be submitted to Clerks office.

Councilmember Flanagan said several entities come together at the ICCA conference to instruct elected officials on changes taking place within the State of Indiana.

Councilmember Webb responded to Ms. Jamieson comments. Councilmember Webb does not believe taxpayers money should be used for some events held in Delaware County.
