This Agreement is made and entered into this second day of August, 2022, by and between The COUNTY of Delaware, acting by and through its governing body, the Commissioners Court, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the CITY of Muncie, acting by and through its governing body, the City council, hereinafter referred to as CITY, both of Delaware County, State of Indiana, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party: and

WHEAREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions and this agreement: and

WHEAREAS, the CITY agrees to provide the COUNTY \$ 16,686.90 of the total JAG award of \$ 37,082.00 for the 2022 Enhanced Patrols Program

WEEAREAS, the CITY agrees to provide the COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY AND CITY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the State enabling act for planning and zoning empowers the Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana to adopt a Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and also provides for amendments to the said ordinance as the need arises; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana has given reasonable regard to the Comprehensive Plan; current conditions and the character of current structures and uses in each district; the most desirable use for which land in each district is adapted; the conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction; and responsible growth and development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA, as follows:

Section 1. That the Delaware County Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, heretofore adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana, on the 11th day of December, 1973, be amended, changed and supplemented so as to include in the BP Business & Professional Office Zone the following described real estate located in Delaware County, Indiana, to wit:

Mr. John Coutinho, EMA Director, said the video wall is updated with new TV's. Mr. Coutinho said there was extra grant money from Ball Brothers (COVID) that was reallocated. Ms. Pam McCammon, Human Resource Director, presented the Monkeypox protocol.

August 15, 2022

Per Jammie Bane, Administrator- Delaware County Health Department

Anyone experiencing symptoms of concern should contact their PCP to seek a medical opinion. If an individual is planning to visit the ER, an urgent care, or the county clinic, if and when possible they should call ahead to notify the facility of their concerns/symptoms in order to receive guidance.

If the physician suspects monkeypox and orders testing, the patient would need to isolate at home pending test results. Isolation should involve individual isolation, avoiding contact with other people as well as animals.

A negative test result would end isolation, assuming the individual is no longer experiencing symptoms that would prevent them from returning to work.

A positive test result will require ongoing isolation. Patients with monkeypox are considered contagious from the date of onset of any of their symptoms (including prodromal symptoms before appearance of rash) until all lesions have crusted, the crusts have separated, and a new layer of skin has formed underneath. This usually takes 2-4 weeks but may take longer in some individuals.

Anyone who is a contact of a confirmed case does not need to quarantine, however, they are required to monitor for symptoms for 21 days from the date of contact. Symptoms to watch

- swelling of lymph nodes
- fever at or above 100.4 degrees fahrenheit
- skin rash
- lesionschills

If a contact develops any of these symptoms, they should begin isolation immediately, notify their PCP of the symptoms and their status as a contact, and request testing.
