

- (d) In the event that the County requests the YOC to house more than ten (10) Delaware County residents in the Center, the YOC will use its best efforts to do so if it has the capacity to do so, without any additional expense to the County.
 - 4. The YOC will provide transportation of juveniles only on the YOC campus.

5. The parties will endeavor, in good faith, to agree upon revisions to the Agreement by March 28, 2023.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC ON CERTAIN PUBLIC STREETS IN DELAWARE COUNTY T. GIMAL

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners are charged with protecting the health and welfare of the citizens of Delaware County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners are obligated to review and, if necessary, amend the Street and Road Regulations of the County Highway System to allow for the more orderly and safe mode of travel on the roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners conducted a public hearing on January 17, 2023 with respect to a number of all way stops and speed limit changes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners determine that certain changes will be necessary to the Delaware County Code, Title 5, Chapter 4, Street and Traffic Regulations.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED: By the Board of County Commissioners, Delaware County, Indiana that Delaware County Code, Title 5, Chapter 4, Street and Road Regulations shall be amended as set forth herein:

- 1. Title 5, Chapter 4, Section 5, is to be amended as follows:
 - There shall be an all way stop at the intersection of County Road 800 W. and Division Road located in Mt. Pleasant Township, Delaware County, Indiana for all traffic.
- 2. Title 5, Chapter 4, Section 8, is to be amended as follows:
 - A. There shall be a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on Nixon Road from Bell Creek to County Road 550 W. located in Mt. Pleasant Township, Delaware County, Indiana.

 B. There shall be a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on County Road 563 E. from State Road 32 (Jackson) to County Road 100 N (Centennial) located in Liberty Township, Delaware County, Indiana.

 C. There shall be a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on County Road 800 W from Jackson Street to River Valley Road located in Mt. Pleasant Township, Delaware County, Indiana.

 D. There shall be a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on County Road 200 N. (McGalliard) from County Road 650 E. to the Delaware/Randolph County line located in Liberty Township, Delaware County, Indiana

 E. There shall be a speed limit of 30 miles per hour on County Road 500 E from County Road 350 N south to Orr Road located in Delaware and Liberty Townships, Delaware County, Indiana

 F. There shall be a speed limit of 30 miles per hour on Orr Road from County Road 500 E. to County Road 525 E located in Liberty Township, Delaware County, Indiana.

 G. There shall be a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on Orr Road from County Road 525 E to the Delaware/Randolph County line located in Liberty Township, Delaware County, Indiana.
- 3. The County Highway Department of Delaware County, Indiana, is hereby authorized to erect appropriate signage pursuant to the Indiana Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
- 4. The penalty for violation of this ordinance shall be as herein setforth in Article XVI, Section 16-1.


