<u>Purpose of Position/Job Summary</u>: Primarily responsible for prosecuting felony crimes. Works under guidelines set by policy, normally performing the duty assignments using methods and procedures at his/her discretion and limited only by policies set by administrative or legislative authority. End results determine effectiveness.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Prosecuting Felony Crimes - 90%

Prosecuting Misdemeanor Crimes – 10%

The Delaware County Prosecutor's Office is in search of an attorney who is committed to a career in criminal prosecution. Delaware County Prosecuting Attorney, Eric Hoffman, is seeking interested applicants for an open position as a deputy prosecuting attorney

assigned to a felony court responsible for prosecuting felony offenses. The preferred candidate is self-motivated to achieve professional improvement, and confident in an ability to surpass exceptionally high expectations for performance and leadership in the area of criminal justice. Applicants with criminal trial experience will be given preference; however, those with no criminal prosecution experience may be considered.

The salary is \$85,000 – \$95,000 based on experience and courtroom ability. This is a full-time position with county health insurance (including dental and eye) as well as participation in Public Employees Retirement Fund (PERF). If selected, the applicant can begin work September 1, 2023.

- 2. Admitted to the State Bar of Indiana.
- 3. Training in criminal prosecution.
