## INDIANA SUPREME COURT DECLINES TO HEAR CONVICTED KILLER'S APPEAL

On March 30, 2015, the Prosecutor's Office filed formal charges relating to the December 24, 2009 murder of Monica "Nikki" Brown. Danny Lee Saintignon Jr. was charged with multiple felony counts including murder. On October 6, 2017, a jury convicted Saintignon of Conspiracy to Commit Burglary, a Class A Felony, Murder, a Felony, Robbery Resulting in Serious Bodily Injury, a Class A Felony, and Conspiracy to Commit Obstruction of Justice, a Level 6 Felony. On January 4, 2018, Delaware County Circuit Court No. 3 Judge Linda Ralu Wolf sentenced Saintignon to 137 years to the Indiana Department of Corrections. He appealed his convictions to the Indiana Court of Appeals.

On January 13, 2017 The Indiana Court of Appeals rejected all of his arguments and affirmed his convictions. Saintignon then requested that the Indiana Supreme Court review his case. On March 14, 2019, the Justices of the Indiana Supreme Court unanimously declined to do so. The Court's Order is attached. Consequently, Danny Lee Saintignon Jr. will most likely spend the rest of his natural life behind bars. According to the Department of Corrections, his earliest possible release date is September 12, 2019. He would be 115 years old.

### Order
