**JUDGE KIM DOWLING-CIRCUIT COURT #6**

Ms. Judge Kim Dowling, presented information about Circuit Court #6. The State is looking to absorb city courts into state trial courts. City courts are often not a court of record. The numbers below show justification of adding courts. The numbers show that Circuit Court 6 is needed. This will be presented to the Summer Study Committee for legislature during the summer of 2019. The Bar Association and Prosecutor Hoffman are in support of the Circuit Court 6. Ms. Dowling is requesting a letter stating this was presented before Council and if legislature approves this, the court would need to be funded.

President Quakenbush asked the numbers of magistrates and master commissioners in other counties. Quakenbush said he has experienced this before as a Commissioner and agreed to Delaware County Court #5 and the city agreed to close their court. This happened but then city realized they were losing monies from fees and opened a city court again. Quakenbush questioned, for political reasons, if another Prosecutor could file cases in city court, if elected.

Ms. Dowling said the Prosecutor does not have to file in city court. Ms. Dowling said most counties have multiple magistrates and master commissioners within Indiana. There are a lot of things that "could" happen down the road but as Ms. Dowling previously indicated the state is not in favor of city courts.

Councilmember Alexander is not in favor of adding an additional court, however, he is in favor of not having city court. Alexander does not know how the county would fund additional staff and court.

Council Attorney, Mr. Bill Hughes, will work with Judge Dowling regarding the letter and will present it to Council in July 2019.

- Completed 'Adolescent Substance Abuse' training and scheduled parent outreach and education event for July 9, 2019 in collaboration with Meridian Health Services. See attached flyer.
- Completed Manufacturing Extension Partnership training. This is designed for individuals new to manufacturing or the workforce, individuals seeking work, may serve as additional new-hire training, or as a way for individuals to update their workplace skills. This training provides a Purdue University Certificate of Learning, MSSC Certified Production Technician Quality Certificate, and an OSHA 10 certification. 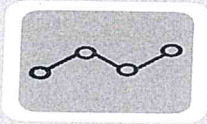

President Quakenbush said he has been involved with EMS. Quakenbush was in support of Paramedic's in late 1970's early 1980 during his election. State of the Art equipment was purchased and Delaware County has tried to pay fair salaries.

#### PRESIDENTS REMARKS

State legislature changed the way community and mental health is funded. Local tax rate has ½ million plus going to comprehensive mental health. The Board does not have anyone from local county, Board of Health, Commissioners or Council. This is mandated that the Auditor writes a check once a year. Quakenbush asked Mr. Steven Craycraft, Auditor, how the new bookkeeping system is coming along and how this is being worked out.

Mr. Craycraft, said the Auditor's office are still working on the new bookkeeping financial system. Mr. Craycraft is in hopes that this can be done with no monies. The Finance System has the capabilities but after ½ dozen phone conversations and meetings, Craycraft said he is should have additional information at July 2019 meeting. This is mandated by the State.

President Quakenbush said if this is something that has to be done then this is the time to do it.

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Ms. Patterson asked that Mr. Jim St. Myer's family remain in thoughts and prayers, due to his wife passing away. Ms. St. Myer was a volunteer during the fair.
