Convicted Killer Jamie Adams Sent to Prison - Again

Muncie, Indiana, April 2, 2020 9:45 a.m. – On today's date, the Honorable Linda Ralu Wolf, Judge of the Delaware Circuit Court No. 3 revoked Jamie Adams's probation and executed his previously suspended sentence. He was sentenced to two years to the Indiana Department of Corrections.

On May 16, 1991, the Defendant was convicted of Murder, a Felony. On June 6, 1991, Adams was sentenced to sixty (60) years to the Department of Corrections. While serving his sentence, he was charged with and convicted of attempted escape from prison. Adams was ultimately released from prison in 2015.

On May 10, 2019, Jamie Adams was convicted of Methamphetamine, a Level 6 Felony and Possession of a Legend Drug, a Level 6 Felony. He was originally sentenced to 2 years to the Indiana Department of Corrections with six (6) months executed and the remainder of the sentence suspended. He was placed on supervised probation. While on supervised probation:

- He failed to report for a drug screen on seven (7) separate occasions.
- He tested positive for Methamphetamine on three (3) separate occasions.
- He left the State of Indiana without permission and was later arrested in the State of Washington.
- He cut his electronic home detention bracelet and fled the State. He was charged with and convicted of escape, a Level 6 felony and found to be a habitual offender. At the sentencing hearing, the probation department and the Prosecutor's Office requested a seven (7) year sentence. The Honorable Kimberly Dowling sentenced Adams to three (3) years to the Indiana Department of Corrections.

During today's revocation hearing, Adams attorney Jacob Dunnuck requested that the Defendant be placed back on probation due to his addiction issues. I requested that the Defendant be returned to prison to serve his sentence.

Jamie Adams is a convicted murderer and career criminal who has proven time and time again that he is either unwilling or unable to follow the laws and rules of our civilized society. He is back where he belongs – behind bars.
