## CONTRACTS OR AGREEMENTS FOR APPROVAL

Mr. Meeks Cockerill said residents of Daleville, Indiana and Westbrook addition filed petitions. Mr. Meeks reviewed the appeals and said they did not meet the criteria in the statute. The first standard rate did not amount to more than 5% yearly from the last rate increase. Neither petitions set forth as to why the rates were not just and reasonable, therefore as a matter of law, the part of appeal failed. Therefore, Mr. Cockerill said the Commissioners did not need to have a public hearing. The Commissioners should adopt both resolutions as followed to end the appeal process.

Mr. Jason Richards, Regional Waste Water Executive Director said several projects are taking place with a \$5 million project at Westbrook, Yorktown, Indiana. Per the State of Indiana, rates must be in order before the project can be started.

No major improvements have been made in Westbrook since 1979. A 60 inch pipe will replace the current 21 inch pipe. The project at Westbrook will be a 12 month project.

Mr. John Brooke, County Attorney said approving both resolutions will end any appeals.

- The District passed Ordinance 2020-03 raising the monthly sewer rate for Daleville, Indiana which is part of the District from \$47 per month to \$60.31 per month.
- The previous sewer rate for Daleville, Indiana of \$47 per month was adopted on October 19, 2011.
- The current sewer rate for Daleville, Indiana of \$60.31 per month was adopted on April 30, 2020.
- 5. The following is part of IC 13-26-11-15(c): "If a district adopts an ordinance increasing sewer rates and charges at a rate that is greater than five percent (5%) per year, as calculated from the rates and charges in effect from the date of the districts last rate increase, the district shall mail, either separately or along with a periodic billing statement, a notice of the new rates and charges to each user of the sewer system who is affected by the increase." (emphasis added)
- The monthly rate increase for Daleville, Indiana is less than 5% per year. The
  monthly rate increase would have to have been over \$72.91 per month to be at
  least 5% per year from the last rate increase.
- The Commissioners received a petition from over 50 rate ratepayers in the District on May 13, 2020.
- The petition does not set forth any grounds for the ratepayer's objection to the monthly rate increase as required by IC 13-26-11-15(d)(3).

WHEREAS, the Muncie Redevelopment Commission, as the governing body of the City of Muncie, Indiana's Department of Redevelopment, owns certain pieces of real property located in the City of Muncie, Indiana, which are specifically identified on "EXHIBIT A" attached hereto (hereinafter, the "City Property");

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Board of Commissioners, as the legislative body and executive of Delaware County, Indiana, desire to acquire the City Property from the Muncie Redevelopment Commission to be used in for various County-related purposes;

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Board of Commissioners own certain pieces of real property located in the City of Muncie, Indiana, which are specifically identified on "EXHIBIT B" attached hereto (hereinafter, the "County Property");

WHEREAS, the Muncie Redevelopment Commission desires to acquire the County Property from the Delaware County Commissioners to be used for various City-related purposes;

WHEREAS, the Muncie Redevelopment Commission desires to transfer said City Property to the Delaware County Commissioners, subject to acceptance of said City Property by the Delaware County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Commissioners desire to transfer said County Property to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission, subject to acceptance of said County Property by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA THAT:

- The Delaware County Board of Commissioners shall transfer said County Property referenced herein to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission:
  - a. Upon acceptance of the County Property by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission; and
  - b. In exchange for the Muncie Redevelopment Commission's transfer of the City Property to the Delaware County Commissioners.
- The Muncie Redevelopment Commission's acceptance of the County Property shall be demonstrated by the adoption of a substantially similar resolution by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission indicating:

- a. The Muncie Redevelopment Commission's intent and agreement to transfer to the City Property to the Delaware County Commissioners in exchange for the transfer of the County Property to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission; and
- b. The Muncie Redevelopment Commission's acceptance of the County Property from the Delaware County Commissioners in exchange for the transfer of the City Property from the Muncie Redevelopment Commission.
- The Delaware County Commissioners shall pay all transfer and recording fees for the City Property and the Muncie Redevelopment Commission shall pay all transfer and recording fees for the County Property.
- 4. The Delaware County Auditor shall provide an executed copy of this Resolution to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission and, upon receipt of a substantially similar resolution adopted by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission, the President of the Delaware County Board of Commissioners shall be authorized to execute all documents necessary to transfer the County Property to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission.
- 5. This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption.

## A RESOLUTION TO MOVE DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA BACK ON TRACK

- WHEREAS, the President of the United States, on March 13, 2020, declared a nationwide emergency concerning the spread of COVID-19 viral infections, and
- WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Indiana, on March 16, 2020, made an emergency declaration in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) disease epidemic; and
- WHEREAS, the County Health Officer has determined that certain measures should be put into place to lessen the potential spread of the COVID-19 virus including the closing of some local businesses; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to I. C. 10-14-3-29(a) the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, IN hereby makes a local disaster emergency declaration; and
- WHEREAS, the Governor has adopted Executive Orders 20-25, 20-26, 20-27 and 20-28 as map for continued protection from the COVID-19 threat as well as a map of reopening the State and County; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana have determined that in response to the emergency believes that the Governor's BACK ON TRACK PLAN should be made a part of the County's Policies for consistency and continuity and that certain parts of the County's the Emergency Declaration of May 8, 2020 should be extended.

## NOW THEREFORE WE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA HEREBY DECLARE THAT:

- 1. A local disaster emergency continues to exist in the County and that we hereby invoke and declare those portions of the Indiana Code which are applicable to the conditions and have caused the issuance of this proclamation, to be in full force and effect in the entire County, including incorporated areas for the exercise of all necessary emergency authority for protection of the lives and property of the people of this County and the restoration of local government with a minimum of interruption. This Resolution is effective immediately and shall be in place until the end of business June 15, 2020.
- The Board of Commissioners adopt the Governor's Executive Order 20-28 in whole as part of their emergency declaration and plan to return to get back on track.

## DEPARTMENT HEADS AND ELECTED OFFICIALS

\*Ms. Molly Hunt, Director of Extension Office provided an update to the Commissioners regarding the Delaware County 4-H Fair. Ms. Hunt requested permission/approval from the Commissioners to use the Fairgrounds for the 2020 4-H events. Ms. Hunt said this is a community event so no final action will be approved until Purdue, Delaware County Commissioners, Delaware County Health Department and Director of Extension discuss the final plan.

Ms. Hunt provided the draft of the COVID-19 Safety Plan. The 4-H event will be more of a "show and go." A virtual Fair will be available for those not attending the open show. This plan only would receive approval if the Governor's plan is in stage 5.

Mr. Shawn Eldridge, Vice President of 4-H Counsel spoke about "premium only" auction. Animals will go back to owners. All previous businesses have been sent a letter with details of the auction. This will be a one pot auction dividing money collected between all 4-H participants.

More information will be provided on July 6, 2020 at the Commissioners meeting.

President Henry recommendation was to allow 2020 4-H events to take place at the Delaware County fairgrounds.

\*\*Commissioner King said he commended the organizers of the protest Saturday May 30 and Sunday May 31, 2020 on behalf of Mr. George Floyd in Muncie, Indiana. Commissioner King said he stands with the protestors and citizens. The rioting and looting, however, is not the answer. Actions are destroying lives by looting. As a country, we should stand together.

President Henry agreed with Commissioner King 100%.

Commissioner Riggin said someone should have reviewed the 17 complaints that had been filed against the officer committing the action.

\* On May 25, 2020, Mr. George Floyd, a 46-year-old black man, was killed in Minneapolis, Minnesota, during an arrest for allegedly using a counterfeit bill.

## PUBLIC COMMENTS, QUESTIONS, OTHER BUSINESS & DISCUSSION

Ms. Gretchen Cheesman, City of Muncie wanted to clarify with Mr. Brooke that approved resolution 2020-016 passed at today's (June 1, 2020) meeting and the resolution passed Friday, May 29, 2020 by Muncie Redevelopment Commission must be substantially similar in order for the resolution to take effect.

Mr. Brooke said that was correct, the resolution adopted today (June 1, 2020) is different than Friday's (May 29 2020) resolution but Redevelopment Commissioner can still adopt "this" resolution to be substantially similar.

Ms. Cheeseman said today's (June 1, 2020) meeting approved resolution was presented at the Muncie Redevelopment Commission and voted down.

Mr. Brooke explained that the version "adopted" today (June 1, 2020) by the Commissioners, in its entirety, was not voted down. There was an amendment made changing some of the properties.

Ms. Cheesman said Muncie Redevelopment Commission approved "today" (June 1, 2020) was voted down and approved another resolution of 19 properties only. The city agreed to pay \$87,900 to Delaware County for properties coming through the deed sale but no trading for other properties. Deadline for city to show site control properties is June 1, 2020. The 19 properties will not be demolished with money coming from State of Indiana unless the Commissioners approve what the MRDC Board presented Friday, May 29 2020.

Mr. Brooke said that is not what he understood. What the Commissioners adopted "today" (June 1, 2020) was a trade that included 19 properties and properties on south Tillotson giving control to the City if the MRDC would adopt a substantial resolution to go with the one adopted today (June 1, 2020).

Ms. Cheesman, Mr. Brooke, Mr. Zane Bishop and Commissioners continued discussion.

Mr. Brooke said that in the minutes of January 2018, MRDC made a request for 13 properties and promised that all of the requested properties would be back on the tax roll in 6 months. Now only 2 are on the tax rolls. Mr. Brooke further stated, that since 2014, the County has provided a total of 247 properties to MRDC and of that total 157 or 65% are still in the name of MRDC and are not back on the tax rolls.

Commissioner King said he had watched the MRDC meeting, in the meeting someone said that MRDC would send the list that they wanted and if it was not approved then MRDC would know that the county is against removing blight properties. Commissioner King said he was not against blight and wanted to work on development. Commissioner King wondered whether it was a political game or does MRC actually want to improve south of Muncie, Indiana. Commissioner King stated that MRDC does not have a Director, attorney or anyone providing guidance other than the Mayor of Muncie.

The Commissioners feel they have offered assistance through the county economic development team to assist Mr. Dave Smith because development in Muncie is a priority to the Commissioners.

For the record, Mr. Brooke read aloud an email that Mr. Zane Bishop, City of Muncie sent on May 18, 2020. The email was addressed to Mr. Ed Carroll, Ms. Gretchen Cheesman, Ms. Heather Ruddick and Mr. Joe Rhetts.

# RESOLUTION OF THE DELAWARE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO TRANSFER COUNTY-OWNED REAL PROPERTY TO THE CITY OF MUNCIE FOR THE HARDEST HIT FUND BLIGHT ELIMINATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Board of Commissioners own certain pieces of real property located in the City of Muncie, Indiana, which are specifically identified on "EXHIBIT A" attached hereto (hereinafter, the "County Property");

WHEREAS, the Muncie Redevelopment Commission desires to acquire the County Property from the Delaware County Commissioners to be used for their Hardest Hit Fund Blight Elimination Program;

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Commissioners desire to transfer said County Property to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission, subject to acceptance of said County Property by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA THAT:

- The Delaware County Board of Commissioners shall transfer said County Property referenced herein to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission upon acceptance of the County Property by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission.
- The Muncie Redevelopment Commission's acceptance of the County Property shall be demonstrated by the adoption of a substantially similar resolution by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission indicating:
  - a. The Muncie Redevelopment Commission's acceptance of the County Property from the Delaware County Commissioners; and
  - b. The Muncie Redevelopment Commission's agreement to pay to the Delaware County Commissioners an amount equal to Eighty-Seven Thousand Nine Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$87,900.00) for the County Property.
- The Muncie Redevelopment Commission shall pay all transfer and recording fees for the County Property.
- 4. The Delaware County Auditor shall provide an executed copy of this Resolution to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission and, upon receipt of a substantially similar resolution adopted by the Muncie Redevelopment Commission, the President of the Delaware County Board of Commissioners shall be authorized to execute all documents necessary to transfer the County Property to the Muncie Redevelopment Commission.
- 5. This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption.
