# BEING A RESOLUTION OF APPROVAL FOR TogetherDM - THE NEW MUNCIE-DELAWARE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND STRATEGIC INVESTMENT PLANS FOR MUNCIE AND DELAWARE COUNTY

- WHEREAS, state law authorizes the preparation of a long-range comprehensive plan and the current plan was adopted in 2000; and
- WHEREAS, there is a need to prepare a new long-range comprehensive plan for Delaware County and the City of Muncie for the promotion of public health, safety, morals, convenience, order, and general welfare and for the sake of efficiency and economy in the process of development; and
- WHEREAS, the new Muncie-Delaware County Comprehensive Plan has been prepared for the Delaware-Muncie Metropolitan Plan Commission containing objectives for future development, policies for land use development, and policies for the development of public ways, places, lands, structures and utilities for the Muncie-Delaware County community; and
- WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan represents a general conceptual plan that identifies the future structural and physical development objectives of Muncie and Delaware County in a way that provides a strong framework for resilience and protects and enhances the best features of the city and county over a twenty-year time period while recognizing the areas in significant need for improvement; and
- WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan, and its development process, has undergone significant citizen participation and public review, notice has been given as required by law, and responsive modifications have been included herein.
- WHEREAS, the Delaware-Muncie Metropolitan Plan Commission hereby favorably recommends by unanimous vote and forwards the TogetherDM document to the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana, for adoption.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, Indiana, as follows:

- Section 1. That the Comprehensive Plan shall be known as TogetherDM.
- Section 2. That TogetherDM, as attached, is hereby approved as the comprehensive plan for Delaware County, Indiana.
- Section 3. That this resolution shall be considered in full force and effect upon adoption.

### PUBLIC COMMENTS, QUESTIONS, OTHER BUSINESS & DISCUSSION

Mr. Jason Kuchmay, Snyder Morgan Federoff & Kuchmay, LLP, Representative of Washington Township landowners said recently landowners discovered they may have an industrial solar farm in their backyards.

Mr. Kuchmay provided concerns regarding filings, amendments, farm ground values, solar installations, solar development, and property value guarantee, etc. Research and outreach interests regarding toxic waste, protection of residents, what the analysis concluded, the loss of agricultural sales by selling less seed and fertilizer. Loss jobs within the community and Mr. Kchmay said recycling panels is very cost prohibitive. Panels are considered toxic, an estimate by the international renewable energy agency was presented to Commissioners. Solar panel disposal in regular landfills is not recommended in case the modules break and toxic materials leach into the soil. The developer that gets the approval may not be the owner once the end of the project takes place. A decommissioning plan is addressed to an extent in the existing plan but it needs to be strengthened. The ordinance requires a surety for the estimated cost in 2021 but could not be sufficient to cover the actual cost 30 years down the road.

MOTION: Commissioner Henry made a motion to send the Solar Energy ordinance back to the Plan Commission. On page 3, section "3" on the maintenance plan it should read any damaged panels which release any substance in the county, Plan Commission and Board of Health shall be notified. A mitigation plan it to be submitted to the county and the Health Board with possible testing to nearby wells. On section "c", there's a minimum of 50 ft. setback including a screen buffer. Commissioner Henry requested that this be switched to 100 ft. setback from adjacent property owners. Section "f" of fencing is needed regarding large game and wooded areas. As of now, Delaware County allows 10% of the fence to be distributed along each section for small and medium wildlife, however Commissioner Henry requested that something be added regarding large game, preferably deer.

Ms. Moody noted that in order for Plan Commissioner to start the process to consider an amendment a Public Notice would take place February 3, 2022. On February 22, 2022 it would come back before the Commissioners. Ms. Moody said she could be receiving an application from Invenergy yet in January 2022.

MOTION: Commissioner Henry recommended that a moratorium take place until February 22, 2022 and be effective immediately. This would allow the corrections to be made before any application is received.
