Ms. Pat Hart, Director of Prevention Council, presented the Prevention Council budget and 2014/2015 grants (14) totally \$56,963 (see below). The grants address prevention treatment for substance abuse in Delaware County.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Tax Abatements-**

President Jones said an Abatement meeting was held regarding Artisan Tool & Die.

Councilman Nemyer said the Tax Abatement Committee gave a favorable recommendation for Artisan Tool & Die.

Mr. Brad Bookout, Economic Development, presented the tax abatement for Artisan Tool & Die, LLC. Artisan Tool & Die, LLC is a family owned, local company with 24 employees (68%) are Delaware County residents. Artisan offers health insurance (50%) paid by the employer and offers a (3%) pension plan. The average wage for jobs at Artisan are \$21, skilled \$31 and starting wage \$12. Knowledge of CNC and EDM machines are needed.

The tax abatement is revenue positive to Delaware County and will generate funds. Mr. Chuck Vanatter, owner of Artisan Tool & Die, LLC is going to purchase a \$450,000 machine that burns

a form into solid steel creating a part. The machine is not in existent in Delaware County or State of Indiana. Competition is with other Tool & Die shops utilizing this type of machine in other States.

President Jones said his knowledge of Artisan Tool & Die is a well-respected tool shop that makes quality parts. Having equipment and being competitive is a must to survive. It is important that Delaware County can maintain or retain manufacturing jobs anytime they can.

Mr. Bookout pointed out that there is an error on the second page of the resolution with the date (should be 2014) and President's name (should be Mike Jones).

Mr. Chuck Vannetter, Artisan Tool & Die spoke with enthusiasm about the electrical discharge machine and what it will bring to Artisan Tool & Die and the community. This is a large machine with a twin head and will be the only one in the Midwest. A lot of work that Artisan Tool & Die does was once done by Guide Lamp. Guide Lamp no longer exists. This new machine will keep Artisan Tool & Die in business. It will cost \$38,000 just to put synthetic oil into the machine. The machines comes with a tool changer, a right hand/left hand cavity at the same time. This will be a lot faster. Vannetter says whoever can do the job the fastest gets the job.

Mr. Vannetter said he needs more employees that are skilled and he is always in need of mold makers and drivers. Vannetter said Muncie needs to get on board to understanding manufacturing. Trade schools should have the opportunity to train tool makers. Dye makers and machinist are not needed but mold and 3 D designer are needed, but they must have experience in molds.

Councilman Quakenbush said it is great to see Vannetter's enthusiasm. Quakenbush said he's also heard that Delaware County does not produce field people coming out of the educational system. Quakenbush said while he served on the board at Muncie Career Center he tried to tell them what industry needed. The home building business is the same problem. Mold makers are very unique skilled craftsman and it is an art in its own right.

Mr. Vannetter said he consistently receives calls from China wanting Artisan Tool to send moles to be built, this would be cheaper, but Vannetter is pro US. Apprenticeship has been considered. Truck Driver (Flatbed) are needed.

President Jones said during budget meetings, Council reduced part-time monies more than it was previously and it should have increased. Ms. Amanda Dunnuck, Council Attorney, provided an ordinance to President Jones, Jones read aloud the ordinance.

Ms. Donna Patterson, Auditors Settlement Clerk, said this was previously done. The presented ordinance is only for the hourly amount of pay for 2014.

Ms. Pattie Lackey, Executive Administrator, said Council had cut 2015 part-time budget lower than it should have been. The Commissioners gave five full-time employees up and those employees went part-time. Lackey will send numbers to President Jones so Council can adjust accordingly. Four Custodians were placed on part-time, Weights and Measures Assistant was placed on part-time too.

President Jones said this does not need to take action at today's (October 28, 2014) meeting.

Ms. Patterson said there was a motion at budget hearings to amend part-time ordinance 2012-014A, paragraph B, to pay part-time Custodians \$10 an hour at 29 hours, effective October 1, 2014.

President Jones will confirm that the numbers in the ordinance are correct with Ms. Lackey and Ms. Amanda Dunnuck.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2014-\_\_\_\_\_**  
**ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2012-014A**  
**AN ORDINANCE TO BE A PART OF THE SALARY ORDINANCE FOR DELAWARE COUNTY PART TIME EMPLOYEES**

**WHEREAS**, It is the responsibility of the Delaware County Council to fix the compensation of the officers, deputies and other employees whose compensation is payable from the Delaware County general fund, county highway fund, or any other fund from which the Delaware County Auditor issues warrants for compensation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Delaware County Council previously passed Ordinance No. 2012-014A which defines part-time positions and assigns pay rates for specific positions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Delaware County Council has eliminated certain full time positions and has given the elected official and/or department head the authority to hire part-time employees to accomplish the job that was once a full time position; and

**WHEREAS**, in light of the elimination of full time positions, Delaware County Council wishes to adjust and add pay rates for certain current part-time positions.

**THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Delaware County Council, State of Indiana as follows:

1. Custodians shall be considered Part-Time 2 positions, with a pay rate of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per hour.
2. This Ordinance shall be effective as of October 1, 2014.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-047

RESOLUTION APPROVING DEDUCTION FROM ASSESSED VALUE OF NEW  
MANUFACTURING EQUIPMENT IN AN ALREADY DECLARED ECONOMIC  
REVITALIZATION AREA

(Artisan Tool & Die, LLC)

WHEREAS, the Indiana General Assembly has enacted a statute, I.C. 6-1.1-12.1 (the "Act"), authorizing certain deductions from the assessed value of new manufacturing equipment (as defined in the Act) for purposes of taxation of such equipment if installed during the period beginning March 1, 1983 and ending December 31, 2014, or such other date as extended by Indiana Code, in an area that is declared an economic revitalization area; and

WHEREAS, Artisan Tool & Die, LLC, will install new manufacturing equipment at its plant located at 3805 West State Road 28, Muncie, Indiana 47303 during the above-described period; and

WHEREAS, by previously adopted resolutions, the Delaware County Council declared and affirmed that the area commonly described as 3805 West State Road 28, which is identified on the attached map and legal description (the "Area"), is an economic revitalization area, and authorizes deductions from assessed value of new manufacturing equipment, installed in the area for purposes of taxation; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of approval of the ensuing abatement, Artisan Tool & Die, LLC, agrees to update the County Council on an annual basis with regard to the status of employment at the facility during the term of the life of the abatement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of the County of Delaware in the State of Indiana:

1. The Delaware County Council finds and determines that the new manufacturing equipment to be installed in the above referenced area by Artisan Tool & Die, LLC, shall be allowed a deduction of five (5) years from the assessed value of such equipment, in accordance with the provisions of I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-4.5.
2. The Delaware County Auditor shall take such further actions as may be required to carry out the purposes of this resolution and to insure the eligibility of the new manufacturing equipment for the deduction described herein.
3. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Delaware County Council and after advertised in such publications as may be required by law.
