COMMITTEE REPORTS

Tax Abatements

Councilman Alexander said the Tax Abatement Committee met and recommended the abatement with Council's approval. The redevelopment area has to be approved before the Tax Abatement. The abatement is for United Construction Services LLC.

Mr. Williams Hughes, Council Attorney, said the preliminary resolution (see below) will be approved at today's (September 26, 2017) meeting. The notice will be published and a public hearing will be held on October 24, 2017. Once the resolution is approved (October 24, 2017) the abatement will be approved.

President Quakenbush said the applicant came forward and talked with Mr. Bookout and stated that they owned more land than they had initially applied for. Revitalization must be declared before tax abatement.

Councilman Alexander said the presented abatement has not changed. The revitalization area was not the topic at the Tax Abatement meeting.

Mr. Brad Bookout said the revitalization area is the parcel property in which the new building will be built.

Mr. Brandon Buck and his partner started United Construction Services. They rented a place and have outgrown the building. Mr. Buck said they want one building, in which equipment can be services, clerical staff, office staff and mechanics can be within the one building. This is a five-year phased in abatement.

Mr. Bookout presented the proposed investment in real property. A list of wages is below. This is a local company that does work with Ball State University.

Mr. Hughes said in the application, the statement of benefits form was used for personal property and should be real-estate. This will be updated before October's meeting.

Although United Construction Services, LLC is a new company that started in January of 2016 they employed 70 employees in 2016 for a total gross wages of \$455,254.18; this amount does not include the benefit package for these employees which was \$180,856.30. While some of these 70 employees are seasonal employees that are full time during our peak season of April through November, United Construction Services has been fortunate to maintain a constant full time employee base of 30 employees and is in hope to grow that number in the near future. Total wages paid to employees (not including benefits) to date in 2017 is \$705,008.59.

RESOLUTION 2017-DDG DELAWARE COUNTY COUNCIL

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING 12.85 ACRES IN HAMILTON TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, INDIANA, AND LOCATED ON INDIANA STATE ROAD THREE NORTH, AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 6-1.1-12.1 allows an abatement of real property taxes attributable to redevelopment or rehabilitation activities in economic revitalization areas as defined therein; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 6-1.1-12.1 authorizes the Delaware County Council ("Council") as designating body to designate economic revitalization areas under the procedures established by law; and

WHEREAS, B & C Development LLC ("Owner") has filed an Application for Tax Abatement and submitted a Statement of Benefits for proposed construction of a new 7,200 square foot building at an estimated cost of \$889,741.00 ("Project") on 12.85 acres in Hamilton Township, Delaware County, Indiana, and located on Indiana State Road 3 North (Parcel No. 18-07-23-300-020.000-006) ("Real Estate"), more particularly shown and described in the Ashton Land Surveyors survey dated March 20, 2017 ("Survey"), attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the proposed new building will house offices and construction equipment storage and shop space for United Construction Services LLC who will employ 12 to 15 new employees within twelve months and retain an additional 30 employees; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes it is in the best interests of the citizens of Delaware County, Indiana, to designate economic revitalization areas in order to expand the property tax base, promote private investment, and create jobs;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

- The Application and Statement of Benefits submitted by the Owner are in proper form and deemed complete as filed.
- The Real Estate is within Delaware County, Indiana, and has become undesirable for, or impossible of, normal growth and development.
- 3. The Council finds as follows:

- a. The estimate of the value of the Project is reasonable for projects of that nature.
- The estimate of the number of individuals who will be employed or retained can reasonably be expected to result from the Project.
- c. The estimate of the annual salaries of the individuals who will be employed or retained can reasonably be expected to result from the Project.
- d. Other benefits as shown on the Application can reasonably be expected to result from the Project.
- The totality of the benefits is sufficient to justify the deduction as requested.
- 4. The Council hereby designates the Real Estate as shown on and described in the Survey as an economic revitalization area for purposes of establishing a deduction to the assessed value of real property.
- 5. The deductions provided by this resolution shall be for the Project for a period of five (5) years from the date of the assessment of the real property improvements upon the Real Estate as follows:

- 6. The Delaware County Auditor shall cause notice of the adoption and substance of this Resolution and setting a public hearing to be held on Tuesday, October 24, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. local time, in the Commissioners' Court Room, Third Floor, Delaware County Building, 100 West Main Street, Muncie, Indiana, to be published in the Muncie StarPress and shall file a copy of the notice and a copy of the Statement of Benefits with each taxing unit that has authority to levy property taxes in the geographic area where the Real Estate is located.
- This Resolution shall be effective upon passage, subject to the public hearing and adoption of a resolution to confirm, modify or reseind this Resolution.

SUPPLEMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR LEGAL SERVICES

THE DELAWARE COUNTY COUNCIL AND BEASLEY & GILKISON LLP

This Supplement is made to the Agreement entered into by and between The Delaware County Council, as fiscal body of Delaware County, Indiana ("Council"), and Beasley & Gilkison LLP, an Indiana limited liability partnership ("Firm") on January 3, 2017.

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Council hereby engages the Firm, through William V. Hughes, Partner, as the principal attorney hereunder, to provide to the Council legal services with respect to the designation of economic revitalization areas for property tax deductions for rehabilitation or redevelopment under Indiana Code 6-1.1-12.1, including, but not limited to: preparation of findings, resolutions, notices, applications for deduction, statements of benefits and compliance, schedule of deductions, and all other related documents; attendance at meetings of economic development and tax abatement advisory committees; consultation with Delaware County economic development officials and taxing authorities; all other necessary, appropriate or requested services. The services described in this Supplement are outside of the scope of the Agreement.
- The Firm accepts the foregoing engagement. The Firm shall be an independent contractor and not an employee of the Council or of Delaware County.
- 3. As compensation for the services rendered by the Firm pursuant to this Agreement as described above, the Firm shall be compensated at the rate of \$165.00 per hour for attorneys and \$75.00 per hour for paralegals based upon time records showing the date of service, work performed and hours devoted to the tenth of an hour submitted to the Council for its review and approval prior to payment. Time records for such services shall be submitted monthly. The total charge for services in connection with any one designation of an economic development area shall not exceed \$3,300.00.
- 4. This Agreement shall be effective upon approval by the Council, and shall be terminable by either party upon ten (10) days written notice.
