Appointments-Mr. Doug Hutcheson-Alcohol Beverage Board, introduced himself and thanked Councilmembers for the opportunity to serve as their appointment.

Ms. Donna Patterson, Settlement Clerk, presented the encumbrance for invoices pertaining to 2018 in a total amount of \$4,383,398.18.

President Quakenbush asked that there is no responses from the audience until the end of the presentation regarding the Jail.

Mr. William Hughes, Council Attorney, presented three ordinances for consideration of the lease agreement for the Jail.

Mr. John Brooke, County Attorney, gave an explanation of the differences of the three ordinances. The Commissioners have reviewed the process for well over a year. The Build, Operate and Transfer ordinance has been approved, financing is the next step. The Commissioners proposal is that they would be using EDIT funding for the Jail project.

Mr. Mark Heirbrandt, Senior Account Executive of Ameresco and Mr. Doug Munz, Senior Project Development Engineer, provided information regarding utility cost.

From past government project analysis and M&V work - typical target values would be:

- Office and Schools \$1.00 1.25 per SF.
- Courthouses and Courtrooms and County Offices \$1.25 1.50 per SF.
- Correctional Facilities Jails (24/7 operation) \$2.20 \$2.75 per SF.
- Location, condition of facility, and configuration of facility.
- Ameresco never provides a guarantee on dollars, we guarantee energy savings on (elec) kWh, (Nat Gas) therms or (water) kcals.
- You will typically see a yearly 3% increase in electric rates and at least a couple of rated changes in a 10 year period. This is why a solar project should be looked at now and for the future.
- We establish a utility baseline over a three year period.
- We deploy data loggers to document existing schedules and usage.
- Ameresco also locks down equipment, schedules and usage of the buildings.
- Our commissioning of the facility is around ASHRAE Standards for comfort, and we do spend additional time commissioning the facility to avoid short cycling of equipment and specify minimum runtimes of equipment.
- Controls and Building Automation Systems are linked in to our M&V of the facilities.

Existing Building - Office Functions = 176,000 SF x \$1.00 / SF = \$176,000

• I went with the lower number here because with the right configuration, schedules and equipment you could be between \$0.80 - \$1.00 / SF.

Existing Building – Jail Functions = 40,000 SF x \$2.50 / SF = \$100,000

- This number is dependent on how much of the existing equipment and systems are used. New Building – Jail Functions = $43,000 \text{ SF } \times \$2.00 \text{ / SF } = \$86,000$
 - At \$2.00 / SF this is using heat recovery and LED lighting. The killer is the 24/7 operation, but there are some additional solar heating options that could be used to cut costs.

Total SF = 259,000 SF

- Good \$420,000 or 1.622 per SF
- Better \$362,000 or 1.398 per SF
- Best \$326,800 or \$1.26 1.30 per SF. Note with 176,000 SF being "Office and Courtroom functions", at 67% of the building you could turn [OFF] when not in use, so you could drive this area toward the lower end of the [\$0.80 \$1.25 range]

Ms. Sue Beesley, Bingham Greenebaum Doll, Bond Counsel, said there is an objection period but not a remonstrance period. Two public notices would be placed in the newspaper.

Councilmembers discussed concern of property tax, local option income tax, bond agreement, the respect and disrespect shown to councilmembers by citizens, crime in the community, and the safety of officers, staff and inmates. Councilmembers are not responsible for building a jail, they are responsible for approving the funding. Another federal lawsuit is a concern to Council, due to the cost that could occur for Delaware County if they are sued again. There is no money in crime or people. Understanding what officers and correctional officers do on a daily basis is a concern.

For the record, Councilmember Bledsoe said Mr. Ryan Ballard set in on meetings before January 1, 2019 to learn the responsibility of being a Councilmember.

A taxpayer (didn't introduce himself) is concerned that poverty stricken citizens are being jailed because they cannot afford to get out of jail.

Mr. Andrew Draper, went on record to apologize to Councilmember Ballard for the treatment he received from Mr. Mitchell.

Another taxpayer spoke (didn't introduce herself) but said the jail plan that is presented is not the right one for the community. She said it is hard to advocate when we are different from those we advocate with.

PRESIDENTS REMARKS

A Resolution Regarding the Impact of Jail Justice Center Project on General Fund was on the agenda, however Councilmembers did not act on the resolution.

President Quakenbush said the Commissioners and Sheriff are still working on the Sheriffs contract.

President Quakenbush said Councilmembers have worked diligently across party lines for several years to try to get the county in the black so monies do not have to be borrowed. Councilmembers are on the verge of this, the goal is getting approached, thanks to county employees with their help in this.

OTHER/NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Emily Anderson, Court Administrator, presented information regarding Family Recovery Court. This would help parents and families and will start in April 2019. Ms. Anderson provided information of how they would like to pay for this position. A grant has been approved, paying half from the grant for Court Reporter Salary and half from Program Coordinator Salary (see below), saving \$14,800 from county general. The appropriation would be presented in February 2019. FICA (1/2) and PERF (1/2) is funded through the grant.
