NEW TOTALS: 199 CASES OF COVID-19 IDENTIFIED IN DELAWARE COUNTY; 18 TOTAL DEATHS

DELAWARE COUNTY, IN- The Delaware County Health Department (DCHD) reports Friday of 1 new death and 14 additional individuals within Delaware County having tested positive through lab testing for SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19 infection); bringing the latest total to 199 confirmed cases and 18 attributed deaths.

The DCHD continues working closely with the local and state officials to ensure that contacts of the patient are identified and that all infection control protocols are being followed.

The 14 most recently confirmed cases being reported since yesterday's Press Release include: 1 male over 40, 1 female over 50, 2 females over 60, 1 male over 60, 2 females over 70, 2 males over 70, 3 females over 80, and 2 females over 90. The 1 new death was a previously identified and confirmed COVID-19 patient. No additional information about the patients will be released at this time due to privacy laws.

Human coronaviruses most commonly spread from an infected person to others through:

- •Respiratory droplets released into the air by coughing and sneezing;
- •Close personal contact, such as touching or shaking hands;
- •Touching an object or surface with the virus on it, then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes before washing your hands; and
- •Rarely, fecal contamination.

The best way to protect yourself from any respiratory illness, including the flu, is to:

- •Wash your hands often w/ soap & water for at least 20 seconds. If soap & water are not available, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact (within 6 feet) with people who are sick.
- •Stay home when you are sick.
- •Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- •Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
