TREASURERS REPORT

Ms. Donna Patterson, Chief Deputy, said there is a substantial loss in revenues other than property tax. Settlement for June 25, 2020 is \$7,000,000 under last year, July 11, 2020 and before August 1, a draw will be needed for the extended tax collection period. More monies will be received before the end of July. The other revenues are the problem.
