## RESOLUTION OF THE DELAWARE COUNTY COUNCIL APPROVING THE DELAWARE COUNTY REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION ISSUANCE OF BONDS (MORRISON)

WHEREAS, the DELAWARE COUNTY ("County") REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (the "Commission") is authorized to issue bonds pursuant to IC 5-1-5, IC 36-7-14 and IC 36-7-25 and all related and supplemental statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Commission found that there are 2015 Bonds of the Commission designated "Redevelopment District Tax Increment Revenue Bonds of 2015 (Morrison Road Project)," dated June 26, 2015, now outstanding in the amount of \$4,000,000.06, and maturing semiannually over a period ending February 1, 2040 ("2015 Bonds");

WHEREAS, the Commission has been advised by its municipal advisor that all or a portion of the 2015 Bonds can be refunded at a savings to the Commission;

WHEREAS, the Commission found and determined that in order to proceed with the refunding of the 2015 Bonds and the planning, replanning, development and redevelopment of the related economic development area ("Area"), it is necessary for the Commission to issue bonds of the Delaware County Redevelopment District ("District"), in the name of the County, in two series, in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed: (i) Five Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$5.500,000) entitled "Taxable Redevelopment District Refunding Revenue Bonds of 2021" ("2021 Taxable Refunding Bonds"), to be applied on the cost of refunding the 2015 Bonds, (which were issued to provide funds for the acquisition of various infrastructure improvements); and (ii) Six Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$6,500,000) entitled "Redevelopment District Tax with the 2021 Taxable Refunding Bonds, (the "2021 Tax-Exempt Bonds" and, hereinafter collectively with the 2021 Taxable Refunding Bonds, the "2021 Bonds"), to be applied on the cost of construction of redevelopment projects in serving or benefitting the Area (collectively, "Project"), with issuance of the 2021 Bonds, capitalized interest and including funding a debt service reserve surety and municipal bond insurance, if necessary, as determined by the Auditor, with the advice of the Commission's municipal advisor and costs associated with the issuance of the 2021 Bonds;

WHEREAS, IC 6-1:1-17-20.5 requires that before the Commission may issue bonds it must obtain the approval of the county fiscal body; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code 6-1.1-17-20.5(e) the Delaware County (the "County") Council is the applicable fiscal body to approve the issuance of the 2021 Bonds,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE DELAWARE COUNTY COUNCIL,

1. The issuance of bonds by the Commission to be repaid solely by the Commission for the purpose of obtaining funds to be applied on the cost of the Project, in a collective principal amount not to exceed \$12,000,000 is hereby approved and authorized.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Ms. Margaret Nikkum, Facilitator for Tea Party announced that 9/11 Summit will take place Saturday, September 11, 2021 at Glad Tidings Church, 3001 S Burlington Drive, Muncie, IN.

Mr. Steven Brand talked about proper staffing and the ability to attract, develop and retain employees. Delaware County has 600 open advance manufacturing employment opportunities. Mr. Brand said this leads to cannibalization from one employer to the other with new companies locating to Muncie, Indiana. The only thing people really care about right now is pay. It is no longer job security, fair treatment, the generation coming in today is about money/pay.

There are no flaws in the pay gaps presented by the Delaware County Sheriff. Those leaving the Sheriff department aren't leaving the trade, they are leaving for more money to other law enforcement agencies. No councilmembers disagree about this, however, councilmembers state that there is no money. Mr. Brand said there is a solution and maybe a short term one-year solution but this could help with the pay gap. This gives councilmembers time to prepare for the future. Raising taxes is the last thing Mr. Brand wants but if you cannot find the room in the budget, Mr. Brand personally would be in favor of a small tax increase to property fund the Sheriff's department. This gives the Sheriff's department the ability to attract, develop and retain the best people for Delaware County. Every good business is made up of the best people. Mr. Brand would be willing to also go to City of Muncie and speak about increasing the LIT tax.

Mr. Tony Johnson, Sheriff Department, read aloud the letter below.

My name is Captain Tony Johnson with the Delaware County Sheriff's Office. I've served with this agency for over 25 years and I have been full time since 2009.

There has been some very serious discussion involving pay for our Sheriff's Office. I have sat down with most of you and discussed our county pay disparity.

2020 was unlike anything we have ever seen.

Covid 19 hit and as a result the county building was closed for 6 weeks. While county employees were sent home to keep them safe, your Delaware county sheriff deputies and correctional officers came to work every day. They were out in the public and they were inside the jail dealing with the community as well as Covid 19.

In 2020 264 deputies and correctional officers lost their lives in the line of duty- 145 of those deaths were due to covid.

2021 to date has seen 212 deputies and correctional officers lose their lives in the line of duty. 130 of those deaths were due to covid.

In 2020 MPD gave their police officers a 9% pay raise. Bringing their base pay to over \$52,000

In 2020 Delaware County Sheriff's deputies and correctional officers received not one penny in way of a pay increase by this council. Did anyone get a raise in 2020? If so, was their job that much more dangerous than our public safety agencies?

Policing is hardly a sought after profession anymore. Despite the raise MPD gave their department, in their last hiring process they received 24 applications and brought that list down to 8 qualified applicants. They currently have 10 openings.

MPD is offering a hiring bonus to any ILEA certified police officer. This describes every deputy on our department. They get a \$5000 up front bonus and walk right across the street making \$10,000 more a year. All they do is change their uniform. They don't have to move and they get all of the same perks, if not more, that they do with our agency.

All pay more than we do. In the past six months we have lost deputies to each of these agencies.

In the past 11 years, there have been 3 pay increases for the Sheriff's Office.

\$1500, \$1000 and \$750. The trend is going in the wrong direction.

Jail officers make \$16.10 an hour. There is current legislation to raise the minimum wage to \$15.00 per hour. How do you think that will benefit us?

In July of 2019 you gave EMS a \$5000 pay raise. Jason Rogers told you that his staff was underpaid, demoralized and ready to leave. This describes the very sentiment of the Delaware County Sheriff's Office right now. You have to fix this!!!

There are options out there that must be examined. This problem does have a solution. You have to be willing to set politics aside and sit at the table with the right people to discuss options that benefit Delaware County. The constituents that you promised to work for and elected you to the seats that you sit in deserve nothing less.

Councilmember Piper stated that raises for budget last year were state statute and mandatory.

Councilmember Webb said his understanding is that all Councilmembers support the Sheriff's Department. Webb said his understanding is the Sheriff staff is waiting to see the outcome of budget hearings. If something does not change, many employees are considering taking a position somewhere else for more money.

President Alexander said many Councilmembers have met with many within the Sheriff's department and all Councilmembers are working toward a significant increase to happen.

Budget hearings start September 8, 2021 at 9:00 a.m.

The Budget approval will be October 12, 2021 at 9:00 a.m.
