Mr. Rick Spangler, County Clerk, brought up during budget hearings that he needed a Deputy in the Election Room but was told by Councilmembers to bring it back before Council in 2023. Mr. Spangler is asking for a new position. The person would be running voter registrations office and appointed elective offices for party chairs. It has become a lot for Mr. Spangler to run the election room and still handle duties in the Clerk's office.

Mr. Spangler reminded Council that is 2015 he reduced the department by four employees. He traded employees for much needed equipment. Approving an employee now would give the amount of time needed for training before election. Mr. Spangler explained the absentee mailing process and the importance of getting this done the day of the request. Weekends, long hours often take place to get the work completed. Mr. Spangler has a Chief Deputy and a First Deputy for the Courts, but would like a First Deputy approved for the election room. Mr. Spangler also reminded Council that he took one employee out of county general during budget time and placed them in the incentive account to help Council with employee raises.

Councilmember Webb said he is not a fan of growing government and even thought condensing staff may be needed due to much needed raises.

Mr. Spangler said voting centers will reduce the workload in the county but the number of absentees and the inhouse voters will be the same.

Ms. Emily Anderson, Court Administrator, backed Mr. Spangler's request.

Ms. Donna Patterson, Settlement Clerk, said the \$100 requested was an oversite/error during budget.

**Mr. Tony Skinner, Sheriff, said he will present numbers for meal costs and a pension updates at February 2023 Council meeting.

Mr. Skinner gave an open invitation to Councilmembers to set up a two-hour meeting to see what Community Corrections, Deputies and 24-7 operations do. All departments would offer this open invitation.

Mr. Skinner said the federal inmate program is one step closer. Mr. Skinner received an email regarding the matter from Washington, DC, however this takes time when dealing with federal government.

Mr. Gavin Green, Coroner, provided an update of the Coroner's office.

Ms. Emily Anderson, Court Administrator, asked about the raise that the Judges gave Ms. Anderson during budget time. Due to conflicting information and questions the stipends have not been used from the raise.

President Piper said Council is in a gray area, there is confusion and questions, there is nothing in place that says it is not okay but nothing saying it is okay.

Councilmember Webb said to be clear Council did not give the stipend, the Judges gave Ms. Anderson their stipend.

Mr. Ben Freeman, Council Attorney, said the Indiana Constitution states that any sitting Judge salary cannot be reduced during their tenure. Does this violate the constitution? The answer was not provided by anyone at State level. Recommendation/suggestion was Council could go back and leave Judges stipends the way they were and fund Emily's raise through county general fund. Council could follow the prior budget appropriations as they were passed and then Council attorney draft an opinion letter of why this was done. In legality it would be resolved by legislature or Indiana Supreme Court. Mr. Freeman said if it went before the Indiana Supreme Court the findings are unknown from Mr. Freeman. A stipend is part of a salary, the question is if the Judges can voluntarily give it up by agreement. The stipend in question is the four Judges giving a portion of their stipend.

Mr. Freeman will write a letter stating the purpose of why this was done.

The Judges voluntarily gave the raise.

Judge Wolf reached out to you a few months ago regarding the judges' stipends. Judge Wolf said she never received a response. I am reaching out to you again per the County Council's request. They need to decide how to handle the situation at the meeting scheduled on January 24, 2023.

The judges (4) gave up half of their stipends for the 2023 budget. Each judge receives \$5,000 stipend from the county. That \$10,000.00 was placed in a new line item as a stipend for Court Administrator.

An employee in the Auditor's office was instructed by SBOA employee (at their conference), after the budget approval in September, that the judges could not do that.

I.C. 33-38-5-6(b) states that "Before November 2 of each year, the county auditor shall certify to the office of judicial administration the amounts, if any, to be provided by the county during the ensuing calendar year for the judges' salaries under IC 36-2-5-14."

IC 36-2-5-14 in summary discusses the "county fiscal body may make appropriations to pay them more than the minimums fixed by statute subject to subsection (b)....may not exceed \$5,000 for each judge"

The judges believe that they were able to voluntarily give up half of their stipends to place in another line item to delegate it towards the Court Administrator salary as a Court Administrator stipend.

The Council wants to make sure the SBOA is in agreement with this.

Good Morning Emily,

Regarding the question about reducing the judges salary. I do think there is some confusion here regarding our position on this issue. At the conference, someone from the county posed the question and we said we didn't know and would have to research it.

Council meeting held January 24, 2023

Our statement was regarding a question that had been posed previously regarding the reducing of a judges compensation. I have included a clip from a previous Bulletin where we lay out the previous question and corresponding reasoning. As you can see, the reasoning is based upon a Court of Appeals case that interpreted the relevant provision in the State Constitution.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS FROM COUNTY AUDITORS FALL CONFERENCE

Question #1: Can the county council reduce the judge's supplemental pay?

Per the Constitution of State of Indiana Article 7 Section 19 "The Justices of Supreme Court and Judges of the Court of Appeals and of the Circuit Courts shall at stated times receive a compensation which shall not be diminished during their continuance in office." Also, the majority opinion in Tipton County, Indiana et al. v State of Indiana on the Relation of Dane P. Nash 731 N.E.2d 12 (Ind. Ct. App. 2000) found that the judges' compensation should be considered in total. Specifically that the compensation provided by the State and any supplemental compensation paid by the county should be considered as total compensation. In this case the State increased the judges pay and the county decreased the supplemental that the county provided. Because the total compensation received by the judge was still as much or more due to the increase by the State, the court found the decrease not to be in violation of the constitutional provision. Answer #1:

As the facts in your situation are different than the ones presented in the previous—the situation for your judges may be different. But I would encourage them and your county aftorney to review the cases at hand and decide on their best course of action.

In these situations where reasonable minds may disagree on the legal outcome of an issue, we always encourage the unit in question to have some sort of memo from their county attorney that explains why the units reasoning was based in law. And we will review that and take it into consideration during the subsequent audit cycle.
